We all look forward to seeing you there! With best wishes for a successful foaling, breeding and racing season.

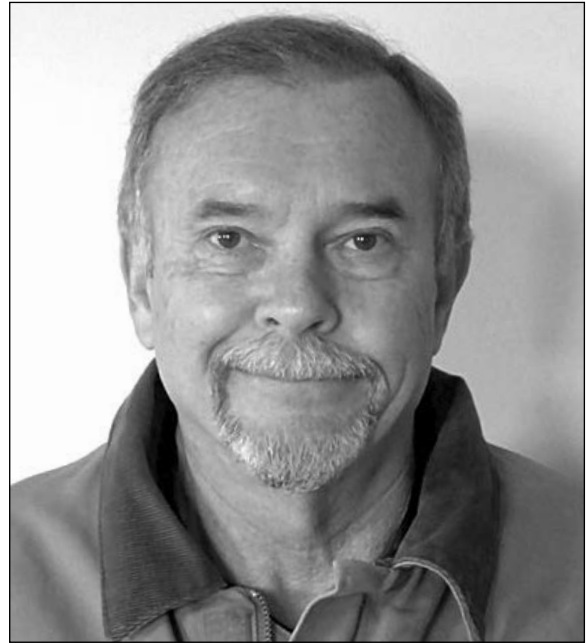

Tax Case Holds in Favor of Virginia Couple

Otis and Alma Jordan of Amissville, Virginia persuaded the Tax Court that their horse racing and breeding activity was engaged in for profit. The couple lived on a 20-acre farm on which they constructed a new barn and made other significant improvements. They owned several thoroughbred race horses, and acquired their first race horse in 1986. They also owned six broodmares which they kept on the farm.

One of their race horses earned modest purses totaling about \$6,000. They were planning on mating their broodmares with stallions owned by others, and wanted to produce foals that, after appropriate training, would develop into successful race horses. They expected that their main revenue would come from purses.

The Jordans bred one of their mares to a stallion that was the grandson of a Kentucky Derby winner, whose other offsprings earned over \$1 million in purses. A casualty occurred, however, when the foal ran into a fence and injured its leg.

The petitioners did not maintain formal books of accounts for their horse racing activity. They paid expenses out of their personal joint checking account or by cash. Cash expenditures were sometimes noted on scraps of paper. They kept receipts of supplies such as hay and feed bought from vendors.

The race tracks provided them with a summary of their earnings and expenses incurred on a horse-by-horse basis.

The facts of the case were fairly weak, but the taxpayer won anyway. Were they lucky or was the judge unusually sympathetic? It's hard to tell. The Court said that the test of whether a taxpayer is engaged in a horse activity for profit is whether he or she entered into, or continued, the activity with the actual or honest objective of making a profit, "The taxpayer's profit objective must be bona fide, taking into account all of the facts and circumstances."

The court noted that the IRS had a strong argument against the taxpayers because they had a consistent pattern of losses, which usually suggests the lack of a profit motive. On the other hand, given the nature of the activity involved, the court said that it was possible that their losses could be recouped if they had just one successful foal. Many of the foals sired by the stallion to which they had bred ended up competing well as Thoroughbreds.

The judge noted that horse racing is a highly speculative venture but that "An opportunity to earn a substantial ultimate profit in a highly speculative venture is ordinarily sufficient to indicate that the activity is engaged in for profit even though losses or

only occasional small profits are actually generated."

The court noted that the petitioners had very little affectionate to any of their horses, and they did not use their horses or farm for recreational purposes. The court concluded that it "simply can see no other reason why petitioners would have engaged in the activity and incurred the resulting expenses unless for profit."

I think the petitioners were very fortunate to have a sympathetic judge, for not all Tax Court judges are quite this charitable with facts along the lines of this case.

The lessons from this case are: (1) Even if you have poor business records or commingle funds, you can win if you have a strong breeding program with carefully selected mating decisions. (2) If you have a history of losses it is important to show that this activity has little or no recreational elements. (3) It is important to make improvements on the farm property consistent with sound practices of animal husbandry. If you are audited by the IRS you have many rights and should consult an expert to discuss strategy.

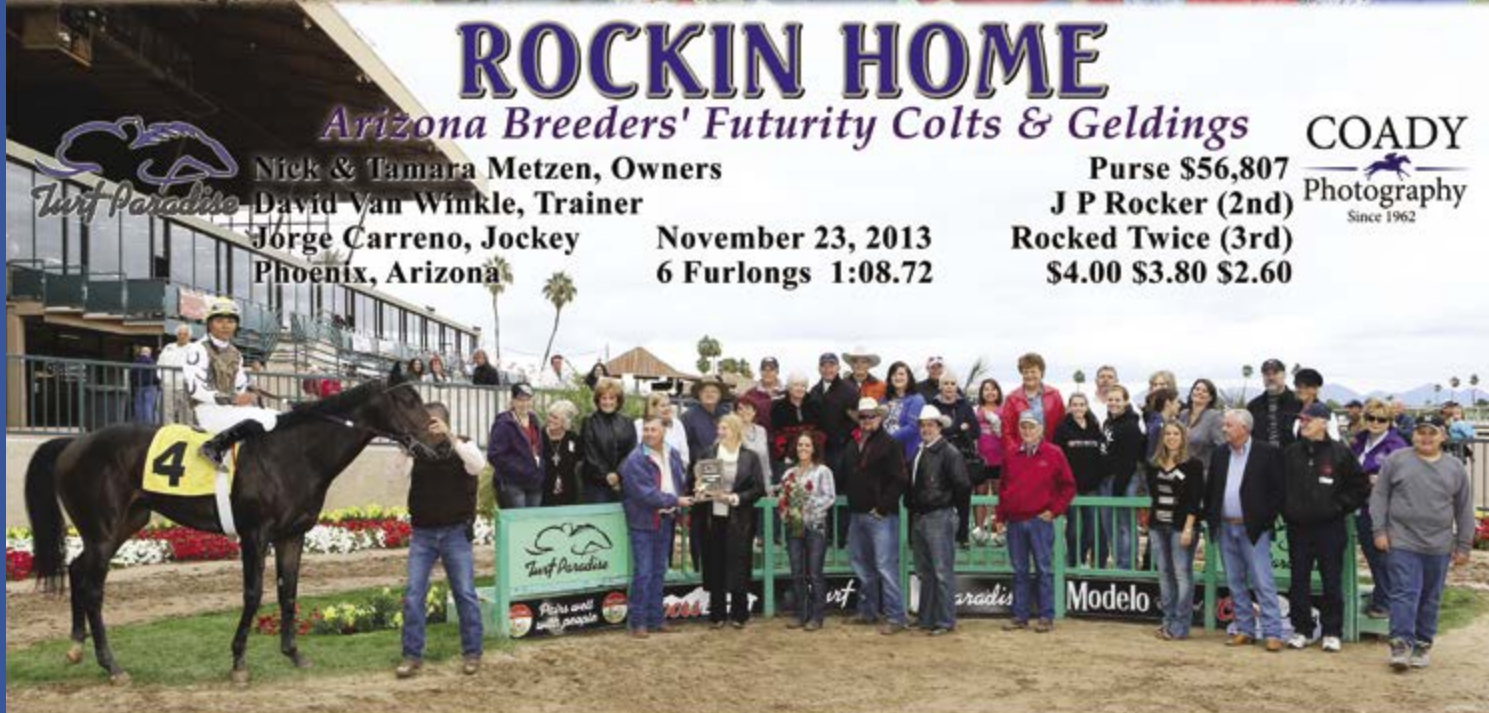

*A look at the Past & Present
Female Riders in Arizona*

Introduction by Michael Napier

It is the consensus that one has to be brave to make a living as a Jockey. It's also the consensus that men and women can be equally brave.

However, it is not until the 1960's when women began to participate in the jockey profession, riding the same Thoroughbreds as their male counterparts. The real trailblazer in expanding the female gender base for the jockey profession was Diane Crump who, in 1970, became the first woman to ride in the Kentucky Derby.

Since then, there have been only 6 female jockeys to participate in the Kentucky Derby, and only one, Julie Krone, who has won a United States Triple Crown race, in the 1993 Belmont Stakes aboard *Colonial Affair*. Krone was also the only woman with a Breeder's Cup win, until Rosie Napravnik won the Juvenile aboard *Shanghai Bobby*.

To this day, no woman jockey has won the Kentucky Derby. The question is not whether that will happen, but rather, when it will happen.

In-roads by females in the male-dominated sport have not been easy. Even today, there are only several dozen female jockeys, compared to several hundred male jockeys.

While recognition as equals in the profession have come slowly, more and more frequently female jockeys are considered excellent riders who just happen to be of the opposite sex.

Women were allowed to own race horses at recognized tracks, but a woman licensed as a jockey was unheard of, prior to 1968. The “era of the modern female jockey” didn’t occur until, Penny Ann Early sued the Maryland Racing Commission, under the Civil Rights Act, to obtain a jockey’s license. She became the first female licensed Thoroughbred jockey in the United States.

Not only have women had to break lawful and restricted barriers, they had to prove themselves to be as physically and athletically capable as any man. It takes ability, guts, sheer toughness and a lot of heart to want to compete on the back of these thousand pound Thoroughbreds.

A successful female jockey in Australia named Wilhemena Smith, rode during the 1900’s, under the name “Bill Smith” on the Queensland racecourses. She would show up at professional events, dressed in her riding gear, but never showed at the race course. Her success as a woman jockey was not discovered until 1975, at the time of her death.

In Arizona we have our own history of women demonstrating their riding talents and they have bravely taken on the challenge of competing in a male-dominated sport.

Lucille Lewis-French was born and raised in Olathe, Colorado. Her father Joe trained Thoroughbreds and was well known for having a competitive string of race horses. She started at the young age of nine-years old competing in pony races around county fair circuits.

In 1960, she moved to Arizona to train a string of her own racehorses. At the time, Dr. Hinshaw (Veterinarian) had to vouch for her horsemanship in order for Lucille to be the first woman to obtain a pony license at Turf Paradise. In her riding career, Lucille won the Silver Cup at Montrose Colorado and was inducted into the *Cowgirl Hall of Fame*.

Lucille’s daughter Donna Woods would begin riding and competing in the same “ladies only” events along side her mother. Donna would ride at the non-professional race courses in Colorado, Utah and Arizona, earning five dollars for each mount and ten dollars for a win.

To earn a living racing at the bush tracks you had to be pretty savvy on how to ride and bet on racehorses. At the non-professional racetracks “Calcutta Wagering” was a simple and fun way to place a bet. An advertisement on how to wager at the fair meets explains the method.

PINKIE SMITH

In 1969, Violet “Pinkie” Smith was the first woman to be licensed as a jockey in the Northwest and was the 6th female jockey to be licensed in the United States. The advancement of female riders competing against male jockeys in a dangerous sport, became a novelty to news media. The media photographed Pinkie, during riding tests, required by the racing stewards to be approved for an apprentice jockey’s license.

After obtaining her jockeys license at Portland Meadows, she was named on to ride her first Thoroughbred race, when the male riders boycotted. The stewards advised them of induced fines, if they refused to ride against a female jockey. Needless to say, the male riders gave in and Pinkie finished seventh on her mount.

The tracks were not prepared with a dressing facility for the female jockey’s. The nurse’s stations were the designated places at most tracks, where Pinkie had to place her tack and dress for each race she rode.

When Pinkie moved her tack to ride at Longacres in Seattle, Washington. Racetrack owner Joe Gottstein, built Pinkie a private jocks-room, which included a sign posted

outside the entrance called *Pinkie’s Pad*. It was specifically designed in a feminine decor. The bathroom had pink tiles and all the necessities equal to the male jockey’s room.

She spent the winter months racing in Arizona at Turf Paradise, for her parents and other owners-trainers. In 1983, she won the Arizona Breeders’ Derby aboard *Arizona Brave*, for trainer Joe W. Weaver. Pinkie’s riding career spanned over twenty years as a multiple stakes winning jockey with earnings over two million dollars.

In 1988, she attended classes to start a new career as a racing steward. She worked as Deputy Steward at the Arizona county fairs and at Turf Paradise as Chief Steward, before retiring. Since her retirement, Pinkie still travels and rides horses.

Currently, she is an active member of the American Competitive Trail Horse Association (ACTHA). Along with her horse *Sporty*, together they compete as a team and have achieved second in the Arizona state ACTHA standings. Retirement has allowed her the time to enjoy traveling and she is leading a relatively stress free life.

Not only was Merrilee beautiful, she was very well educated. As a young girl, she attended a catholic high school, then later in life went to college to become a teacher. She taught English & Bible literature for many years and could speak Spanish fluently. Merrilee had a modeling career and was photographed riding horses in many western magazine's, as well as other various publications.

Merrilee Murphy-Warner, started riding race horses in the 1940's. She was about 11 years-old. Her father, Floyd Murphy was a horse trainer and engaged her to ride all of their horses at the bush tracks of Oklahoma and Colorado. The unrecognized race meets commonly held at county fairgrounds, would offer horse racing events, rodeo relays and roman style riding competitions. Merrilee, would ride competitively in all three events.

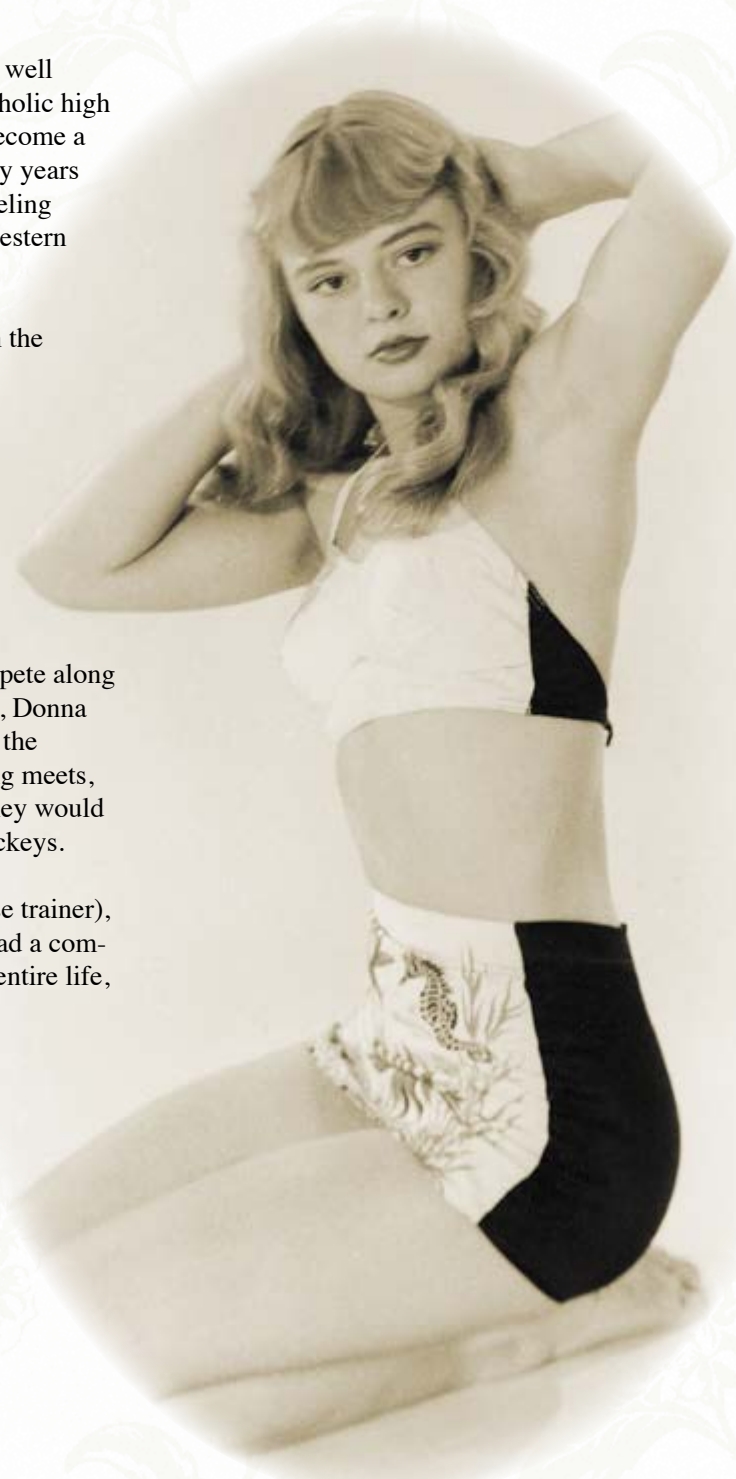
At the Durango, Colorado fairgrounds she would compete along side seasoned female jockey's such as, Lucille French, Donna Woods and Betty Smith in “ladies only” events called the Powder Puff Derby's. There were many summer racing meets, where these women competed against one another. They would often finish in the money more times than the male jockeys.

In an interview with her daughter Jacque Guerra (horse trainer), she said her mother was fearless, hard working, and had a competitive spirit. Merrilee was involved with horses her entire life, and her daughter Jacque carries on the family horse racing legacy.

Lucille French, Donna Woods, Pinkie Smith and Merrilee Warner, were of the elite and talented women, who helped pioneer the way for female jockeys and horse women today. When an amazing talent is discovered on the televised American Idol shows, a coined phrase is sometimes used.....

“She had the Whole Package”

Merrilee Murphy-Warner certainly had it all. Beauty, brains, bravery, and riding talent, but above all she had heart.





Tammi Piermarini, is a veteran rider and began her career as a jockey at Suffolk Downs in Massachusetts. She holds the record for third-leading female jockey of all-time, surpassing Patti Cooksey and Vicky Baze's record in 2012 with 2,139 wins.

In an interview with Tammi, she said, her family and perseverance is what keeps her going. Tammi is married and is the mother of three children, Izabella, (daughter) Johnny Vincent (son) and "Princess" Sophia-Lawren, (daughter). Working hard is what every jockey has to do to make it in this business. I've had set backs with injuries, but I keep riding to support my family and to be as successful as I can.

My family is very supportive of my career. My husband John, works as my Agent at Suffolk Downs and is a great help with the kids. He gets them off to school in the morning and brings them to the races to



watch me ride in the afternoons.

Being a jockey may seem dangerous to the average person, but it's second nature to Tammi Piermarini. It's the way she's made a living, most of her life.

Among other accomplishment's from riding at the east Boston oval, she has acquired five leading rider titles. The New England Turf Writers Association has honored her three-times with the Eli Chait Memorial Award for Outstanding Jockey. Tammi is enjoying the warm climate here in the Southwest, as she continues her riding career at Turf Paradise.

Anne Von Rosen is riding superbly this year and ranks 4th on the Jockey Standings at Turf Paradise for the 2013-2014 race meet.

Anne was born and raised in Gersfeld, Germany. She came to the United States when she was 27 years-old, after seeing an advertisement

for a job to work at an Equine Hospital in Lexington Kentucky. Anne applied for the position and went to work there as a vet assistant.

Prior to coming to the United States, Anne exercised horses at racetracks in Europe and became a freelance rider at Keeneland. Soon, she considered applying for an apprentice jockey's license.

After obtaining a license, Von Rosen rode her fist race in Tampa, Florida. She decided that she needed to get some more experience and rode horses for trainer Vic Hanson at the South Dakota "bush" racetracks. Hanson, moved his stable to Minnesota to race for the summer and Anne went there to continue riding as a professional jockey. She's been riding at Canterbury Park for about twelve-years.

At every race meet, Von Rosen exercises and breezes horses. Her hard work and determination keeps her lean and fit, as she rides for some of the top trainers at Turf Paradise. Her most memorable stakes race was winning the Cotton Fitzsimmons Mile, purse \$75,000 Guaranteed. She won aboard Saratoga Boot for trainer Mike Chambers.

Arizona is home for Anne Von Rosen. She divides her calendar as a professional jockey racing at Turf Paradise in the winter and Canterbury Park in the summer.



Jennifer Reid grew up on a small farm in Melfort, Saskatchewan, Canada. She sharpened her riding skills by participating in barrel racing and various gymkhanas around her hometown.

Olds Alberta College offered an equine course, which she joined in 2007. The equine center maintained 15 to 20 head of horses for the students to develop their skills. Part of the course requirement for the students to achieve their certificate, was to acquire sixty-gallops over a short period of time.

By the time Jennifer graduated with her certificate from college, she was fit and able to gallop, tough Thoroughbreds. In addition, to learning how to exercise the horses, Jennifer managed, fed, groomed and obtained an in-depth knowledge of equine behavior.

She began as an apprentice jockey in 2012 at Winnipeg, and rode for trainer Tom Gardipy Jr. Tom campaigns in Canada with a large stable, and was instrumental in launching her riding career. Riding to earn a living at the race track is much more challenging than being in school. There are number of jockey's that come to the Southwest to ride, so you really have to work hard to meet people and ride competitively.

During the 2012 racing season in Winnipeg, Jennifer was in contention for the leading jockey title. She won four races on the Sunday program and lost by one win. Although, the leading rider title was a loss, she did earn recognition for leading apprentice and top female jockey. She is currently in Phoenix, riding at Turf Paradise and expects to return to Canada towards the end of April.



Katie Fales is from Auburn, Washington. She received her apprentice jockey license in 2003 and began riding at Emerald Downs. She gives credit to trainer Charles Essex for helping start her riding career. Katie's most memorable stakes win was aboard a racehorse named *Kissintheboysgoodbye*.

At an early age, she remembers being in love with horses and wanted to be around them all the time. Everything she read and all of her book reports were about horses. Because she had a deep desire to ride horses, becoming a jockey was a great career move for her. When asked, why did you want to be a jockey? She responded with, well I loved horses and now I'm lucky to be paid to ride them.

Katie was riding competitively at Turf Paradise during the 2013 season. She ranked 10th in jockey standings, when she suffered serious injuries, while exercising a horse on the training track. The horse she was riding bolted to the outside fence and she was thrown over the rail. She sustained a concussion to her head, shattered T-5 vertebrae, broken left scapula and eight broken ribs. Despite the serious injuries Katie has endured, her attitude is always positive and her smile is bright.

In an interview with Katie, my first questions was how are you doing? She said, she's doing well and the doctor's expect her to make a full recovery. Of course the next

question was, would you consider getting back in the saddle, again? Her answer, was that she's been thinking about it, because she loves to ride.

She especially considers riding again, when she see's other jockey's win, on horses that she previously rode. She said, but for right now, she'll spend more time with her son *Ryder* and just take it easy.

We wish her all the best in the years to come. ♦

DON SCHNELL OWNER-TRAINER

Having a successful meet at Turf Paradise with Arizona-breds

Trainer Don Schnell arrived at the Turf Paradise fall meeting with 13 head of horses in tip top shape. He campaigned his stable during the summer months at Canterbury Park in Shakopee, Minnesota.

Upon his arrival you could say he was “holding bullets” ready to fire off his Arizona-bred horses at the competition. Within the first ten days of the meet Don won five races with *Idling*, *Tempe*, *Romantic View*, *Key Affair* and *Claypool*.

In November, he won with *Toyon Bay*, a dark bay/brown filly, bred by Dave Williams. By December, Don captured three more wins, including the \$35,000 Guaranteed Arizona Juvenile Fillies Stakes with *Idling*. She raced close to the pace, rallied five wide on the turn, and closed steadily to wear down her rivals. *Idling* got up in the final strides to finish in 1:17.00.

Rounding the corner into February 2014, Schnell won with *Kale*, *Aware* and *Lewiston*. This gave Don, 12 wins out of 49 starts under his belt and placed him eighth in the owner standings. Don's Arizona-breds have earned him over \$101,593.00 in purse money. Not to mention, he will earn approximately 12% in owner awards from Turf Paradise at the end of the meet.

Schnell has been training horses for twenty years and began his career in Alberta, Canada. He has raced at various Canadian tracks, such as Northlands Park, Assiniboia and Calgary; as well as many other racetracks throughout the United States.

He has been coming to the Southwest to race at Turf Paradise, since the late 1970's and has purchased several Arizona-breds from local Thoroughbred Breeders (Weir Ranch, Dave Williams and Triple AAA Ranch).

Last year, Schnell had great success with his two-year-old gelding *Lewiston*, as he captured the 2012 ATBA Fall Sales Stakes Futurity. *Lewiston* has earned a total of \$98,337 in his racing career.

TURF PARADISE



Dan McFarlane, captured his 1000th career win on December 23, 2013, in the ninth race with ***Enter Back***. Patti and Hal J. Earnhardt III, are the winning owners of ***Enter Back*** and she was ridden to victory by Jockey Skyler Whiteshield.

McFarlane has been a Thoroughbred trainer for more than two decades and has achieved multiple stake wins with his horses. His over-all purse earnings exceed \$10 million, since he began his career in 1987.

Arizona is home, for the 49 year old McFarlane. He was born in Pontiac, Illinois, and is married with two children and has one grandchild. Although, Turf Paradise racetrack is where he bases his operation, he races his string of Thoroughbreds in various states, such as California, Iowa, and Minnesota during the summer months.

In an interview with Dan, he said, since high school he has always been interested in horses and wanted to learn more about them. As fate would have it, Dan was preparing to go out of town, when he saw that

he had a flat tire on his car. His father told him to go down to Bob's tire shop to get it fixed.

He met a gentleman named Clark Jenkins, who owned Bob's Tire Corral. Through conversation, Mr. Jenkins told Dan about his quarter horse's. Jenkins recognized the interest that McFarlane had in horses and told him to come by the ranch sometime. A second flat tire on Dan's car brought him back to meet with Jenkins again and soon he went to work on his ranch.

Shortly, after finishing high school, Dan worked for quarter horse trainers, Owen McDaniel and John Bassett. He became interested in working for Michael Dickenson, after reading an article about him bringing a stable of Thoroughbreds to Maryland to race. McFarlane worked his way up from being a groom to assistant trainer, and learned the business of racing Thoroughbreds from the best trainers in the country. Before long, McFarlane was training his own successful stable of Thoroughbreds.

Just as Thoroughbreds are linked back through their bloodlines, Dan discovered his own family lineage. His mother gave him a photograph of his grandfather holding the winner of the 1929 Clark Handicap, in Louisville, Kentucky. The name of the horse was Martie Flynn, and was trained by McFarlane's great uncle Robert McGarvey.

Robert McGarvey, was awarded the United States Champion Thoroughbred Trainer in 1937. He trained for Mrs. Ethel Mars' Milky Way Farm and conditioned some well-known horses such as *Forever Yours*, who was named the 1936 American Champion Two-Year-Old Filly. McGarvey trained

many other champion Thoroughbreds and competed in the 1937 Kentucky Derby with two entries named *Reaping Rewards* and *Military* for Milky Way Farms. *Reaping Rewards* finished third in the 1937 Kentucky Derby, behind the legendary winner *War Admiral* and *Pompoon*, was second.

As history has a way of repeating its self and destiny has a way of leading us down an unknown path, perhaps McFarlane's family bloodline may have sealed his fate into becoming a Thoroughbred trainer. Maybe someday we will hear about McFarlane winning The Clark Handicap or Kentucky Derby. It could happen!

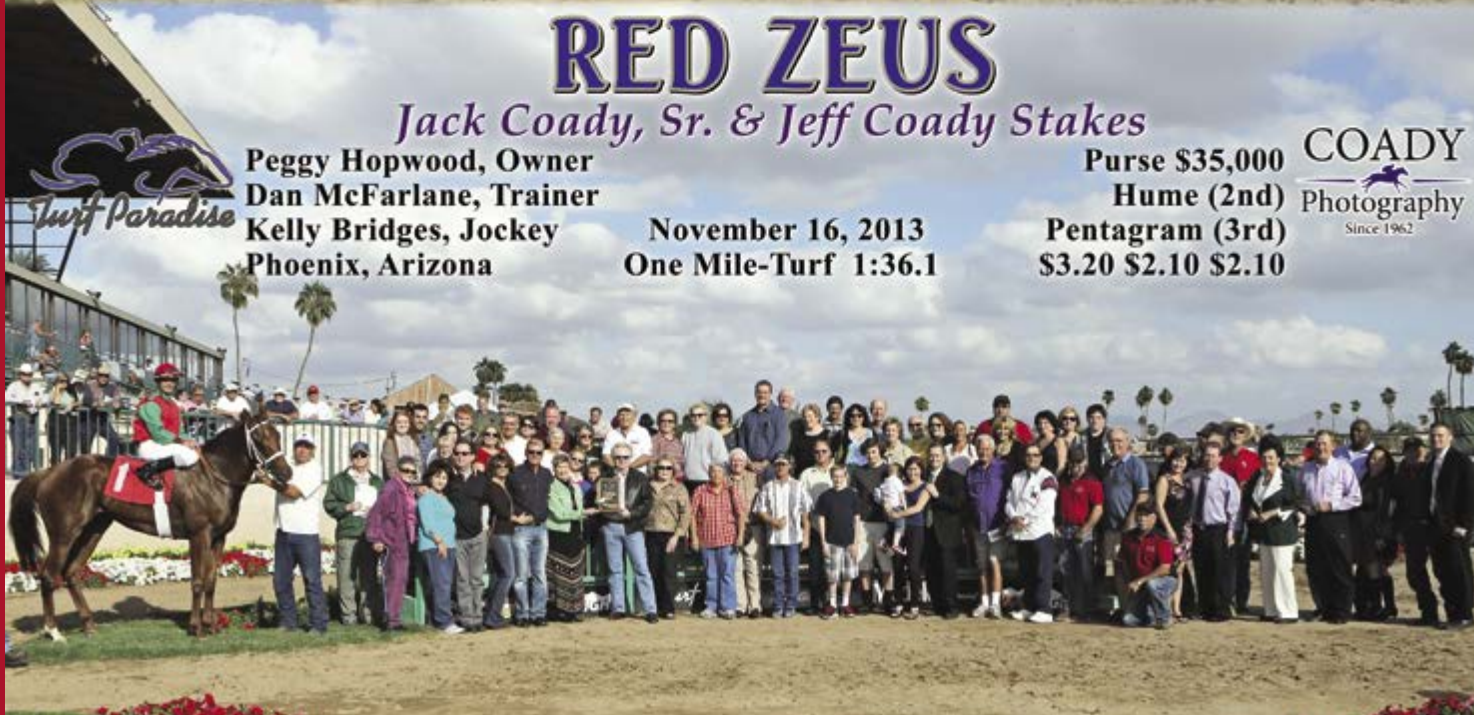
