The Material Participation Test Can Trick Taxpayers

O ften enough taxpayers who are audited in connection with their farming or livestock activities are questioned on the issue known in the tax law as the "material participation test." Under this legal test, you are permitted to deduct losses against outside salary and wages only if, among other things, you "materially participate" in the activity. Many duties, such as training of animals, showing of show horses and racing of race horses, are delegated to qualified experts, and sometimes the IRS will question the validity of your own participation in decision making, in an effort to say you have failed to meet the material participation test.

This usually happens in the context of ventures that involve a partnership or joint venture. For instance, Joseph Machado of Long Beach, California, entered into the LB Partnership with four other partners to purchase a broodmare named La Barbara. One partner was the managing partner and was responsible for maintaining the books and records of the partnership and for paying all expenses. The partnership made decisions by majority vote of all six partners. The broodmare was bred to a number of stallions, but the partnership generated losses over a period of 7 years.

The Tax Court denied Mr. Machado the right to write off these losses against his income from a trucking business he owned because it held he did not materially participate in the partnership. Accordingly, his losses were limited by the passive income rules of Section 469 of the IRS Code and could not be used to offset his non-passive income.

This case illustrates the importance of obtaining advance legal guidance whenever you enter into a partnership if you intend to write off possible losses against nonpassive income sources. The material participation test is something you must plan on meeting and complying with, and is not something to be treated lightly. As a general rule, a taxpayer will be regarded as materially participating in a partnership if he is involved in the operation of the activity on a "regular, continuous, and substantial" basis.

What does that mean? A threshold requirement for meeting this test is that the taxpayer has participated in the activity for more than 100 hours during each taxable year. A taxpayer can establish the extent of his participation by any reasonable means including "the identification of services performed over a period of time and the approximate number of hours spent performing such services during such period, based on appointment books, calendars, or narrative summaries." But in the case of Mr. Machado, the only evidence he presented at trial regarding participation in the partnership was his uncorroborated testimony that he spent hundreds of hours researching potential stallions to breed with La Barbara, and a calendar log that reflected 15 entries for phone calls he made relating to the partnership. Even with that meager evidence, the number of hours shown was less than 100 hours per year.

The kind of activities that a taxpayer should be able to document during each year may include the following: consulting with advisers, other breeders and veterinarians, attending horse shows, horse sales, or races, seeing horses being worked, keeping business records, discussing matters with one's spouse and other partners, implementing or formulating business plans and revising them, reviewing finances, making cost projections, making disbursements, speaking with vendors on the telephone or in person, talking to potential customers, grooming horses and tending to the physical labor that is part of proper animal husbandry, and performing other tasks and decision-making functions. But it is imperative that records be kept to reflect the number of hours involved, and the number must be l00 or more hours per year.

In my opinion, the material participation test does not apply to ordinary stallion syndications, which are not partnerships in the technical sense, but instead are co-ownership entities where each owner has a fractional interest in the stallion. Still, the IRS has been known to challenge taxpayers on the material participation test in these contexts. I think part of the reason is that some revenue agents are confused as to the application of this provision of tax law.

It is important to keep in mind that the material participation test is supplemental to the overall IRS Regulations concerning the objective intention to make a profit. Even if you can prove material participation in a horse activity, the IRS could still find the venture was merely a hobby by arguing that you do not have the overall intention to be engaged in a trade or business for profit or that there are other elements, such as recreation, lack of reliance on experts, or insufficient showing of the amount of time expended in the venture—to satisfy IRS Regulations on the subject. **P**





In the ATBA Breeders Futurity he won going six furlongs on the dirt, then won going six and half furlongs on the dirt in an allowance optional claiming race. He finished third in the Stallion Stakes Derby going 7 1/2 furlongs on the turf and came back to win the Gene Fleming Breeders Derby racing one and one sixteenth miles on the dirt. This was his third win, with lifetime earnings of \$68,981. Pretty nice return on investment for owner Michael Feigenbaum. He paid \$2,500 for his champion at the 2013 ATBA Fall Yearling Sale.

At the close of the Turf Paradise meeting we will be watching Propector's Blues campaign at Arapahoe Park in Colorado this summer. Congratulations and Good Luck this season! **P**



JOANNE DYE BREEDERS' OAKS - One Race - Fillies NO TRIALS

Oaks for three-year-olds fillies. Starters shall not exceed ten. To start in the Oaks all entrants must pay \$300 to pass the entry box by the usual time of closing for the Oaks. In the event there are more than ten at the time of entry, the starters shall be determined at that time with preference given to those entries that have accumulated the highest earnings, with winners preferred regardless of earnings. Entries not drawn into the body of the race will be placed on an also-eligible list in order of preference. In the event of a scratch in the body of the race prior to the official scratch time, entries on the also-eligible list will be moved into the body of the race based upon their order of preference. In the event that two horses have the same amount of earning position on the alsoeligible they will be determined by lot. Any nominee excluded from running as a result of the aforementioned preference rule shall have the entry fee refunded. Weights: Fillies 117 lbs.

ALL RACES WILL BE RUN UNDER THE FOLLOWING RULES.

All races will be restricted to 2015 Arizona-bred foals, registered and certified by the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders Association. To be eligible to start in the Futurities or the Derby/Oaks foals must be registered and certified by February 1, 2017. The ATBA will deduct ten percent of all nominating and sustaining payments for clerical fees before each race. The balance to be divided as follows: Original and sustaining payments to be split 50% to the Futurities and 50% to the Derby/Oaks. (Futurities and Derby/Oaks monies to be split % by gender). Monies will be divided: 50% to winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth; 3% to fifth; 2% to sixth; (in the futurity 1% to the next six finishers) (in the derby/oaks 1% to each of the next six finishers) and 4% to be paid to the nominator of the winner of each race. To remain eligible for the Derby/Oaks, horses do not have to start in the Futurities, however all sustaining payments must be made through October 15, 2017. To remain eligible for the Derby/Oaks an additional \$300.00 is due January 15, 2018.

In the event of cancellations, nominating and sustaining payments already made will be refunded to appropriate parties less the administrative fees stated herein.



Directly in the middle of this gathering stood an un-tethered racehorse moving within the crowd as if participating in the conversation. Veteran Jockey, Scott Stevens has won his seventh Leading Jockey" title at Turf Paradise. He won 104 races finishing in front of Giovanni Franco who ended the meet with 97 victories. Scott has won many leading rider titles over the years at different race tracks such as Canterbury, Les Bois Park and on the Northern California Fair circuits.

Stevens gives credit to his agent Chad Anderson, for helping him stay on live mounts during the season and for managing his everyday business. Scott has been riding Thoroughbreds and Quarter Horses for nearly 40 years and has achieved 4, 447 wins. Almost all athletes sustain injuries during their careers and race riding is considered a very dangerous sport. Last year Scott injured his wrist at Canterbury, but healed up in time to start the fall meet at Turf Paradise.

Stevens has always been known as a hard working guy and dependable among his colleagues. He has been involved with safety issues as the Jockey's Guild Representative in Arizona and helped negotiate better insurance coverage for his fellow riders. He strives to make sure their safety is first and foremost. Scott has been nominated twice for the George Woolf Award, which recognizes jockeys whose ontrack careers and personal character are held in high esteem by their peers. Scott has certainly displayed worthiness in his lifetime of achievements. And as one of his admires stated... "He's a class act"!

This summer he plans to take some time off to relax and do some scenic traveling. He's looking forward to visiting his parents home in Boise, Idaho, but does not plan on riding at any designated track this summer. Although he has accepted mounts for a few stake races from trainers Robertino Diodoro and Molly Pearson. Congratulations on your outstanding achievement! *****

Vesticular Stomatitis (VSV)

A horse on the grounds of Turf Paradise tested positive for Vesticular Stomatitis. This became a concern for horsemen getting ready to move their stock to other race tracks for the summer racing season. Luckily, the out break happened at the end of the meet and the majority of the horses had already left the grounds weeks prior to the incident. The infected horse had to be treated and then quarantined to prevent further spread of the disease.

According to articles regarding the type of symptoms the animal will display are vesicles, erosions and sloughing of the skin on the muzzle, tongue, teats and above the hoofs of susceptible livestock.

Certain measures of caution should be taken when treating or caring for an infected animal. Rubber gloves, cleaning of horse trailers, buckets, webbings etc, all should be cleaned and disinfected.

The disease can be transmitted by insect vectors, mechanical transmissions and livestock movement. Therefore, renders necessary to quarantine infected animals for about 21 to 30 days while treatment is admistered. Most border crossings were closed down to horse's wanting to enter neighboring states from Arizona. We heard as far away as the Canadian border that horses were not allowed to cross without proper health certificates.

Should you suspect your horse could have this disease contact your veterinarian right away. Horse owners and veterinarians should contact state and federal animal health authorities and take necessary precautions to isolate the animal until it has recovered from treatment and animal health authorities have determined the animal is no longer a threat to spread the disease further.




