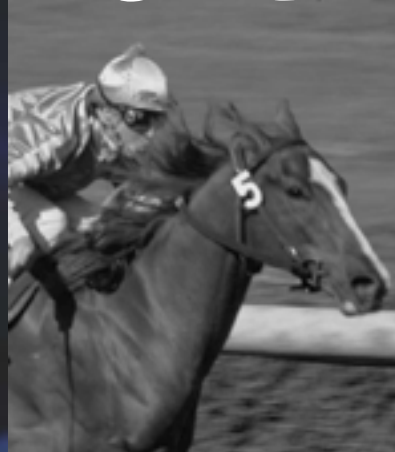

Barton raced nine wide into the homestretch aboard Hey Ez Money and dueled late in the final strides to the wire to prevail over Lieutenant Margie on the outside to win by neck. Lieutenant Margie put in a game effort and took the place, while Waste It Wisely closed steadily in the lane and got up for show.

Hey Ez Money striding out beautifully over the turf

course gave the race fans an exciting show with a nail biting photo finish. The purse for the 2016 Stallion Stakes was \$43,880.00, which brings his lifetime earnings to \$38,505.00. It was his second win in four starts and his first stakes victory. Hey Ez Money raced over a firm turf course and covered the 7 ½ furlongs in 1:31.20.

Hey Ez Money is trained by F. C. Frazier and owned by Tamara Anderson, Brent Stapley, Delwyn Ellis and Linden Hatch. Congratulations to the winning connections!

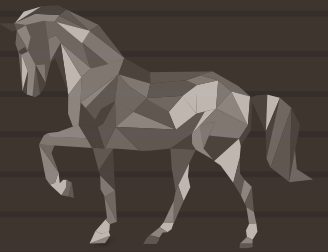

ATBA MEMBERSHIP MEETING & AWARDS DINNER FOR ARIZONA CHAMPIONS OF 2015



The Annual Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders Association Awards Dinner began with guests mingling during the cocktail hour and viewing the display tables of silent auction items. The ATBA celebrated another successful year and we gathered at the Turf Paradise Terrace room to honor the 2015 Arizona-Bred Champions and the 2014 ATBA Sale Stakes Champions.

Newly elected, ATBA President Marvin Fleming welcomed the members and guests and opened the general membership meeting. He extended a special welcome to Turf Paradise management, HBPA and all of the owners, trainers and breeders of our 2015 Champions. He thanked all of the platinum, silver and bronze sponsors along with all of the silent auction donors for their generous contributions that helped to make the evening possible for our association.

Fleming spoke of the challenges that the Arizona Breeders Association is facing in restoring funding for needed breeder awards. The funding for breeder incentives would in effect solve many of the problems that horse racing is challenged with today. The most important of those are increasing the Arizona-bred horse population and the number of horse's consigned to our fall. It would in turn help increase field sizes at the racetrack with a supply chain of horses populating the long race meet.

Marvin reflected back to 1958 when C.W. "Doc" Pardee organized a meeting on his farm at 51st Avenue and Glendale. A gathering of 71 people attended the meeting and the Race Horse Breeders Association of Arizona was founded. The purpose of the meeting was to form a non-profit corporation to further the cause of breeding better racehorse's in the state of Arizona. Original proposals of the bylaws stated that there was a great need for an organization to promote legislation to enact a breeders law compensating horse breeder's from the states portion of the pari-mutuel handle. As far back as the very first meeting held in 1958, it was

recognized that our industry ***required an incentive fund*** to breed Arizona-bred horses.

In 1956, two years prior to the fore mentioned meeting Walter Cluer opened Turf Paradise and put Arizona racing on the national scene. Racing Stables, owners and trainers from across the country and Canada wanted to come to Turf Paradise to race. This created many large and small farms that handled the overflow of horses coming to race and many of those farms began breeding Arizona-bred horses.

During this time the breeding industry in Arizona was great. Percentage wise, breeders received one of the highest percentages in the country. The breeders incentives were based and paid on the winners share of the purses won.

At the peak of our industry Arizona was suppling over 400 horses annually to the racetracks.

The race meets were nearly ten months long, the winter weather in Phoenix was incomparable to any other city and fans went to the racetrack. Future generations were exposed to the sport of horse racing and all was well.

Phoenix started to become one of the largest metropolitan areas in the United States. It now has all four major sports franchises competing for the entertainment dollar. The Native American Tribes received exclusive rights to casino gambling in Arizona, basically creating a monopoly and we now have had competition not only for the sports dollar, but for the wagering dollar.

To counteract the wagering competition the racing industry began simulcasting and advance deposit wagering and many off track betting (OTB) facilities were established throughout Arizona.

During this time of transition the funding for breeders incentives stopped being generated by the industry. We then received funding through the states unclaimed property fund, that was eventually discontinued.

There has since been some temporary funding

available for our breeders and more funding might be available as our goal of restoring our breeders awards is completed.

In order to revive the breeding industry the funding will have to be large enough to attract the breeders back that we have lost, and to get the breeders we still have to increase the number of mares they are breeding and make it lucrative enough to have people from outside of Arizona to want to breed and foal horses in our state. This is the goal of the Board of Directors representing our association and we will continue to pursue this goal which would benefit the entire breeding and racing industry in Arizona.

President Fleming closed his speech to the membership with regards to the 10% bonus that was

implemented for owners of Arizona-bred horse's running in open races during the 2015-2016 race meet at Turf Paradise. He stated, that we would like that to be continued as we work with Turf Paradise, HBPA and the state to get our breeder awards and industry back to where we were are all part of a winning solution.

Marvin wished everyone good luck and to enjoy the rest of the evening recognizing the accomplishments of the 2015 Arizona-bred Champions. And also, a great day of racing at the Arizona Breeders' Festival on the following Saturday, April 23, 2016. He then turned the microphone over to Chaplain John Shumaker who lead us into prayer before dinner and gave a special blessing for the people and horses participating in the scheduled races for the Breeders' Festival Day of Racing.

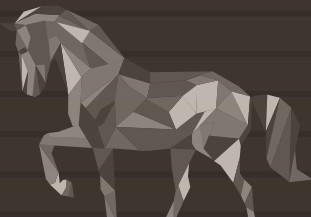

They spend endless hours caring for all of the horses and have taken on a tremendous expense to feed them, administer proper care for their feet and tend to their medical needs.

Heidi's In Charge had 10 starts in 2015, as she made her first racing debut in the 2015 ATBA Spring Sales Stakes Futurity Trials and finished third. In her next start she finish fourth in the Spring Sales Stakes Futurity, value of the race \$60,492. She campaigned over the summer in maiden special weight races at Prairie Meadows in Iowa and at Canterbury in Minnesota.

Returning to Turf Paradise in October she won a maiden optional claiming race. Heidi's In Charge won her next two starts in the futurity trials and then captured the 2015 ATBA Fall Sales Stakes Futurity valued at \$89,186. In December she bounced back to capture her third straight win in the Arizona Breeders' Futurity (fillies division) valued at \$48,000. She closed out the 2015 Turf Paradise racing season in the Arizona Juvenile Fillies Stakes after a tough battle in the lane as she tried to make a bid at the leaders racing seven wide at the top of the homestretch to finish fourth. ♦

Coolidge began his racing career at Assiniboia racetrack in Winnipeg, Canada. His first start was in a maiden special weight race going four and one half furlongs on the dirt finishing second. He raced back nine days later and broke his maiden going five furlongs in maiden special weight conditions. Coolidge's first stakes race was in the Winnipeg Futurity where he finished second, just behind his Arizona-bred stablemate Heber. In mid-September Coolidge shipped to Albuquerque, New Mexico to race in the \$55,000 guaranteed Manzano Stakes, and won at six furlongs by 1 1/4 lengths. He came to Turf Paradise to train in the fall with four races under his belt and captured the \$50,000 guaranteed 2015 Arizona Breeders' Futurity (colts division) by a half length over Two The Punch for the place and Bushrod for the show. He closed out his two-year-old racing season with five starts and three wins. ♦

Legislators need to take a closer look at how a supply chain of horses will help the racing industry in this state and understand that without a permanent and significant dollar amount (meaning at a minimum \$1.3 million) dedicated to a breeders incentive plan Thoroughbred breeders can no longer afford to maintain their operations. Neighboring states offering lucrative incentives have created a shift of broodmares leaving Arizona to foal elsewhere. Although the ranch is located in Arizona, Owens has found an alternative solution to sustaining his ranch operation’s while enjoying his passion for raising Thoroughbred racehorses.

On behalf of Triple AAA Ranch, Marissa Owens, graciously accepted her grandfathers award at our banquet from Director Shawn Haggstrom. The ATBA would like to Congratulate Triple AAA Ranch for their many years of breeding quality racehorses and for their dedication to the racing industry. ♦

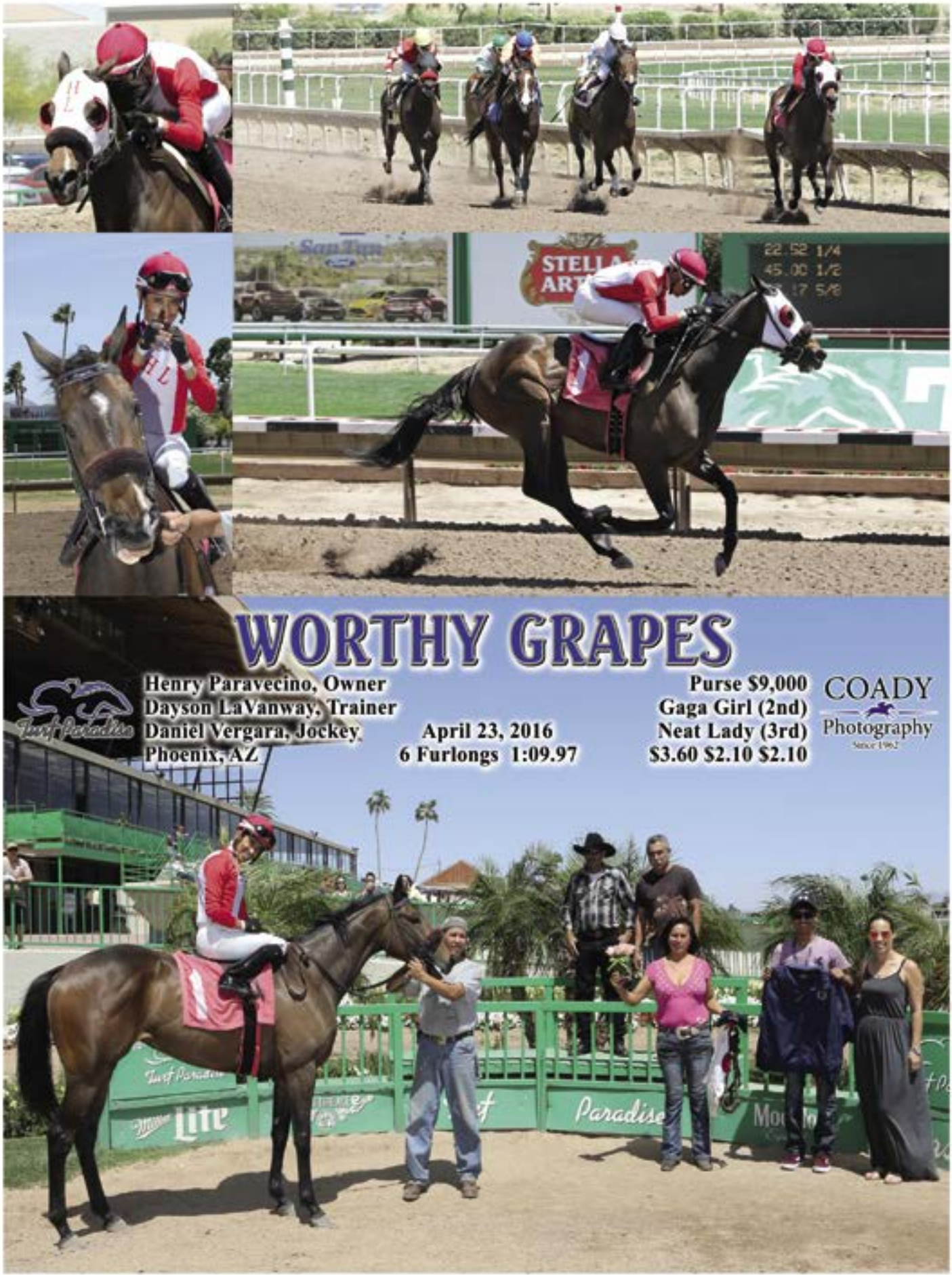

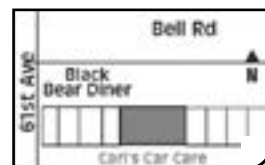

Gene Fleming was one of the founding members of the ATBA and played an integral part in commercially breeding hundreds of Thoroughbreds for the racing industry. Since his passing in 2011, the Gene Fleming Derby is one of the most important black-type races for Arizona-breds in our state and it proudly carries his name. Gene's sons Marvin and Gerald Fleming and their respective families carry on the legacy of breeding Thoroughbred racehorses at their farm in Willcox, Arizona. This years Gene Fleming Derby was carded as the fourth race, with a field of six horse's going postward at a distance of one and one sixteenth miles on the dirt.

Scrap Iron broke alertly and pressed the pace racing into the first turn. He dropped back to third as he raced along the back straight keeping close to the pace setters. *Hey Ez Money* began to pressure *Heber* racing just a length off the lead moving on the outside into the final turn. *Scrap Iron* moved three-wide to the outside of *Hey Ez Money* and made a bid leaving the quarter pole. *Scrap Iron* kicked in the after burners in the homestretch and wore down *Heber*. It was a "too close to tell" finish as both horses raced gamely towards the wire. The photo showed that ***Scrap Iron*** got up in time to win the Gene Fleming Derby by a nose! Heber took second, while Two The Punch finished well to earn the show.

Scrap Iron was raced lightly as a two year-old with only two starts, he won his first race in an \$8,000 maiden claiming race on December 5, 2015. Turning three-years-old in January of 2016, Scrap Iron won his next start racing for (never won two races) \$15,000 claiming tag. Scrap Iron continued up the ranks in an Allowance Optional Claiming for \$20,000 and then started in the Turf Paradise Derby, where he finished sixth.

Scrap Iron has started eight times in his juvenile career and has proven to be a versatile racehorse at different distances. This was his third win, with lifetime earnings of \$40,844. The Gene Fleming Derby is the ATBA's special featured race on Arizona Breeder's Festival Day as it carries on a family legacy and a prestigious meaning for years to come as each winner earns a place in history.

Derby for three-year-olds. Starters shall not exceed twelve. To start in the Derby all entrants must pay \$300 to pass the entry box by the usual time of closing for the Derby. In the event there are more than twelve at the time of entry, the starters shall be determined at that time with preference given to those entries that have accumulated the highest earnings, with winners preferred regardless of earnings. Entries not drawn into the body of the race will be placed on an also-eligible list in order of preference. In the event of a scratch in the body of the race prior to the official scratch time, entries on the also-eligible list will be moved into the body of the race based upon their order of preference. In the event that two horses have the same amount of earning position on the also-eligible they will be determined by lot. Any nominee excluded from running as a result of the aforementioned preference rule shall have the entry fee refunded. Weights: Fillies 117 lbs. Colts/Gelding 120 lbs.

JOANNE DYE BREEDERS' OAKS - One Race - Fillies • NO TRIALS

Oaks for three-year-olds fillies. Starters shall not exceed ten. To start in the Oaks all entrants must pay \$300 to pass the entry box by the usual time of closing for the Oaks. In the event there are more than ten at the time of entry, the starters shall be determined at that time with preference given to those entries that have accumulated the highest earnings, with winners preferred regardless of earnings. Entries not drawn into the body of the race will be placed on an also-eligible list in order of preference. In the event of a scratch in the body of the race prior to the official scratch time, entries on the also-eligible list will be moved into the body of the race based upon their order of preference. In the event that two horses have the same amount of earning position on the also-eligible they will be determined by lot. Any nominee excluded from running as a result of the aforementioned preference rule shall have the entry fee refunded. Weights: Fillies 117 lbs.

ALL RACES WILL BE RUN UNDER THE FOLLOWING RULES.

All races will be restricted to 2016 Arizona-bred foals, registered and certified by the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders Association. To be eligible to start in the Futurities or the Derby/Oaks foals must be registered and certified by February 1, 2018. The ATBA will deduct ten percent of all nominating and sustaining payments for clerical fees before each race. The balance to be divided as follows: Original and sustaining payments to be split 50% to the Futurities and 50% to the Derby/Oaks. (Futurities and Derby/Oaks monies to be split % by gender). Monies will be divided: 50% to winner, 20% to second, 10% to third; 5% to fourth; 3% to fifth; 2% to sixth; (in the futurity 1% to the next six finishers) (in the derby/oaks 1% to each of the next six finishers) and 4% to be paid to the nominator of the winner of each race. **To remain eligible for the Derby/Oaks, horses do not have to start in the Futurities, however all sustaining payments must be made through October 15, 2018. EQUINE ENCORE FOUNDATION HEROES

In 1988 when I joined thousands of others rooting Winning Colors to a victory over the boys under a perfect ride from Jockey Gary Stevens in the Kentucky Derby, I thought all Thoroughbreds' retirement would be the same as hers. I envisioned lush green pastures and a continuance of meticulous care they had received while they were racing. By 2005, after training for 9 years at Arizona and New Mexico tracks, this vision had faded to black. A life of ease only existed for the select few. For the rest it was a life of uncertainty and often horror. This had nothing to do with connections of the horses being cruel and uncaring. It had everything to do with economics. Only Donald Trump could support all of the horses that he or she had raised or trained. All geldings were in jeopardy regardless of their performance at the track.

Equine Encore Foundation was founded in 2005 to help address the problem. Many other aftercare facilities sprung up as well, but all were quickly over-whelmed by the demand and the economics. Concerned horse owners and trainers had to be turned away. Some of them simply refused to give up and sought other avenues for their horses. A case in point is the recent retirement of Grandpa Roy, a multiple stakes placed 12 year old gelding in the Troy Smith barn. Troy and former owner Mark Dyer of Stable HMA refused to let this dark bay son of *Exploit* fall through the cracks. They contacted Cass Dewey regarding his retirement. Cass does not run a non-profit corporation, but she has a heart as big as Dallas regarding all animals, especially former racehorses. Operating with only her private funding, she had been re-homing Thoroughbreds for over 30 years. When she was contacted by Troy & Mark, she hooked up her trailer and headed for Turf Paradise to pick up this aging champion. Kudos to Troy Smith, Mark Dyer and Cass Dewy!

Equine Encore Foundation would also like to recognize the owners and trainers at Turf Paradise who have placed horses with us through the years.

We all have heroes! The above folks are mine!

Camille is owned and trained by Tomas Hinojosa, it was Hinojosa's first stakes win. Congratulations to owner/trainer Tomas Hinojosa and breeder Triple AAA Ranch.

Senate Bill 1435 was signed by Governor Ducey to appropriate \$200,000 from the state General Fund in FY 2017 to the Department of Gaming for the Arizona Breeders' Awards Fund.

House Bill 2127 passed which will end greyhound racing in the state of Arizona by December 31, 2016. Live racing at Tucson Greyhound Park will end in June. However, they will remain open for simulcasting.

Mark your Calendar for the new ATBA Sale Dates & Deadlines for closing entries. The 2016 ATBA Fall Yearling & Mixed Sale will be held at Horseshoe Park Equestrian Center in Queen Creek, Arizona on November 17, 2016. Look for your consignment forms in the mail this summer.

ISSUES FREQUENTLY RAISED IN IRS AUDITS

IRS agents are individual people with varied experience and seniority. Often, it is necessary to “educate” an auditor on an industry with which they are not familiar – such as the horse or livestock industry. If you are audited in connection with a horse, livestock or farming activity, the auditor will first want to determine whether the arithmetic matches – whether the amount of deductions claimed, for example, adds up properly. The auditor will usually want to see backup invoices and proof of payment of the various items.

Delving further into the substance of the audit, you might anticipate a variety of questions about your claim that the activity is operated for profit (despite perhaps a history of losses, or in the case of startups, little or no history at all).

So, what are some of the typical details that the auditor might want to explore?

1. What was your startup year? What research did you do before deciding to enter this particular field? Who did you consult, and what advice was given? What specifically did you find out about making a profit in this field?
2. Describe your operations, i.e., your breeding or racing program, how you select pedigrees, horse shows or races you have entered, and names and qualifications of professional trainers you employ. Do you have a written contract with each trainer?
3. Do you have a written business plan? If not, what specifically is your business plan?
4. What have you done to change your operations to cut down on costs, improve efficiency, or otherwise move towards making a profit?
5. How much time do you you expend in the activity, and what sort of tasks do you perform? If you have a day-job, how are you able to put in that amount of time?

6. If your activity is operated on your own farm or ranch property, describe the facilities. What is the fair market value? What improvements have you made? Did you or do you have an expectation that the property will appreciate in value as a result of your improvements and stewardship?
7. How do you keep records? Is there a separate bank account? Do you keep separate files on each horse?
8. What clinics or seminars have you have attended and what publications do you read to help enhance your knowledge of the industry?
9. Describe your efforts to advertise and promote the animals. What actual horse sales have you achieved?

These are the types of things a thorough audit might involve. It is prudent to consider these questions and issues in mind in conducting your ongoing operations. Perhaps some of your record-keeping needs to be improved, for instance. Perhaps it would be prudent to have a written business plan, or written contracts with trainers. And so on.

Sometimes people are audited simply on a random basis; other times there are red flags that could trigger an audit – such as significant losses or large tax deductions. The best approach is to have a representative meet with the auditor (usually this involves several meetings), and narrow down the issues to the extent possible. Perhaps the auditor will find common ground in some issues, perhaps not. Either way, there is an appeal process that allows the appeal agent to take a fresh look, and often disputes can be settled at that level.
