The A.T.B.A. was organized in 1967 as a non-profit organization "dedicated to the betterment of the Thoroughbred industry in the State of Arizona". Since 1967 the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders Association has had an influence on almost all aspect of racing laws and regulations which has benefitted all horsemen running in the State of Arizona.

The goal of the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders Association is to serve its membership and to grow into a strong viable organization with the ability to purchase land and build our own sales pavilion.

Fifteen directors serving for three years each on a rotating basis, govern the policy of the Association. The directors also assume duties during the year such as attending Arizona Racing Commission meetings and attend legislative matters pertaining to our industry.

The main source of income for the A.T.B.A. is our annual fall Thoroughbred mixed sale. Consignments come from all over the western part of the United States. All yearlings that are consigned and pass through the sale ring become eligible for the A.T.B.A. Spring & Fall Sales Stakes which are run the following May and October as 2 years old with an estimated purse of \$75,000. (May - \$25,000 bonus paid to an Arizona-bred winner, October - \$100,000 bonus paid to an Arizona-bred winner)

The pretty filly is conditioned by trainer Manuel Ortiz, Sr. and owned by Tim M Bankers. This two-year old filly trained well at Emerald Downs preparing for this futurity. During her juvenile racing season she won her 2018 Sales Stakes trial and came back to win the ATBA Fall Sales Stakes. Senoradiablo won her trial heat in the Turf Paradise Open Spring Futurity and come back to finish 2nd. The Fillies division purse was \$66,900. The winner's share was \$30,222.00 and the final time of the 6 furlongs race was 1:11.30. Senoradiablo was purchased from the 2017 ATBA Sale for \$53,000 for the new owners Tim M Bankers. He's home stretch was giving the racing fans an exciting finish. Loud N Proud drew clear by 2 lengths nearing the wire and won the 2018 ATBA Fall Sales Stakes Futurity (Colts & Geldings Division). The colts & geldings division purse was \$94,009. The winner's share was \$52,227 and the final time of the 6 furlongs race was 1:11.35. Loud N Proud was purchased from the 2017 ATBA Sale for \$6,200 and began his juvenile racing career in Arizona in a trial, summering in Prairie Meadows and returning to Arizona for the futurity. Loud N Proud is owned by Eikleberry, Yother, Fleming and Gessmann. He was trained by Kevin Eikleberry. The breeder of Loud N Proud is Fleming Thoroughbred Farm, LLC and this is the first foal out of their mare Hindu Kush by Red Sky's. Loud N Proud is sired by Margie's Wildcat. IRS Enforcement Stand

For horse owners who do not have two year profit years in a seven year period, the IRS will want to take a look at your activity. A history of losses is the major 'red flag' issue that triggers audits for people who take tax losses in connection with horse ventures.

Numerous Tax Court cases have referred to the case of *Louis Filios v Commissioner of Internal Revenue* [224 F. 3d 16 (1st Cir. 2000)], which decided against the taxpayer.

The Tax Court found that Mr. Filios was not engaged in his activity for profit for several reasons. For one, the court said Mr. Filios "did not have budgets, income statements, balance sheets, income projections, or financial statements for the activity," other than those compiled by his accountant to prepare tax returns. The lack of these types of records could be a problem for many horse owners whose overall business records often fall short.

The IRS wants to see records that indicate a profit motive, such as records used for the purpose of cutting expenses, or those that can be used to help increase profits and evaluate the overall performance of the business on an ongoing basis.

Another concern of the IRS is whether the taxpayer's method of operations generally continues unchanged (despite a long period of losses), or whether there are cost-saving measures implemented.

In addition, the IRS as well as the Tax Court wants to see whether you possess expertise regarding the business end of the activity, or whether you have relied on other who have expertise. Specifically,

it is import to seek expert advice regarding the economic or business aspects of the activity. If you have developed economic expertise of your own, it's important to be able to prove this.

Mr. Filios spent between 10 and 20 hours per week on horse activities. He did not ride any of the horses. On average he retained horses for three to four years, giving them adequate time to show their racing potential. His best horse generally ran in races paying purses from \$12,000 to \$30,000.

He subscribed to various industry publications, and read numerous horse racing and breeding books. He studied pedigrees, racing records, and racing earnings of thoroughbred stallions.

The court concluded that "the sheer magnitude of petitioner's losses, the consistency with which they were incurred evidence that he was not engaged in the activity for the purpose of earning a profit."

He was a pioneer in using vitamin and mineral supplements as part of the diet for his horses. He personally decided which vitamins and minerals to use, mixed them, and sent them to the trainer to give to the horses. He did not keep records showing which vitamins or minerals went to which horse.

He attended horse auctions to buy and sell horses. He talked to breeders. He visited farms in Kentucky and tracks in New Jersey where he stabled his horse. He signed all checks relating to the activity and reviewed all of the track purses and race results. A bookkeeper kept his records, including statements from racetracks, records of monies won and other records. She prepared annual summaries and spreadsheets

showing disbursements by category, and verified the accuracy of charges and statements charged to petitioner by the track, such as jockey fees.

The taxpayer visited breeding farms and training centers in England, Ireland, France and

Germany. Futher, he took courses about horses at Cornell University, and stud records were “excellent and meticulous, “and were ‘very much in line with industry practice.’”

Despite all this, the court found fault with almost everything, including the fact that expenses should have been kept on each horse individually, and that he “never conducted written business studies for his horse racing and breeding activity. Similarly, he never prepared a written business plan or budget for the activity.”

The court said that Mr. Filios never hired business advisers or consulted with experts on the economic aspects of a horse venture. He did, however, use professional trainers, veterinarians, horse farms, breeders, auctioneers, and jockeys. He frequently called his trainers and talked to them about which horses to race and which horse to train. He asked their opinion, and often followed their advice. He personally arranged for his mares to be bred, and he personally reviewed and executed the stallion contracts. The court nevertheless faulted him for not requiring his trainers “to submit plans of operations or any other written reports.” The only written reports that the trainers submitted were informal notes they occasionally jotted on their invoices.

In his testimony, the court said that Mr. Filios came across as not seriously concerned about changing methods of operation to decrease expenses. (He had about 84 horses which the court

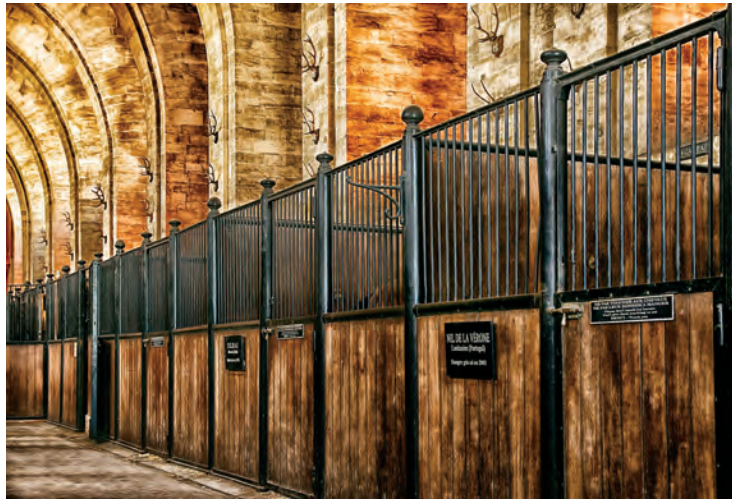
felt was more than necessary to carry out an efficient racing-breeding operation.) He testified that his horses were easy to sell because he kept lowering the price until they sold, or he would just give them away.

The court concluded that “the sheer magnitude of petitioner’s losses, the consistency with which they were

incurred evidence that he was not engaged in the activity for the purpose of earning a profit.” The court added: “A record of continued losses over an extended period of the time is plainly relevant in discerning a taxpayer’s true motivation.”

This was perhaps a rather harsh opinion, but one which the IRS is delighted with. In order to withstand IRS scrutiny nowadays it is important to have your operations thoroughly looked at by an expert, and often it is advisable to obtain a tax opinion letter from an attorney to insure that your operations are operated in accordance with IRS and Tax Court guidelines.

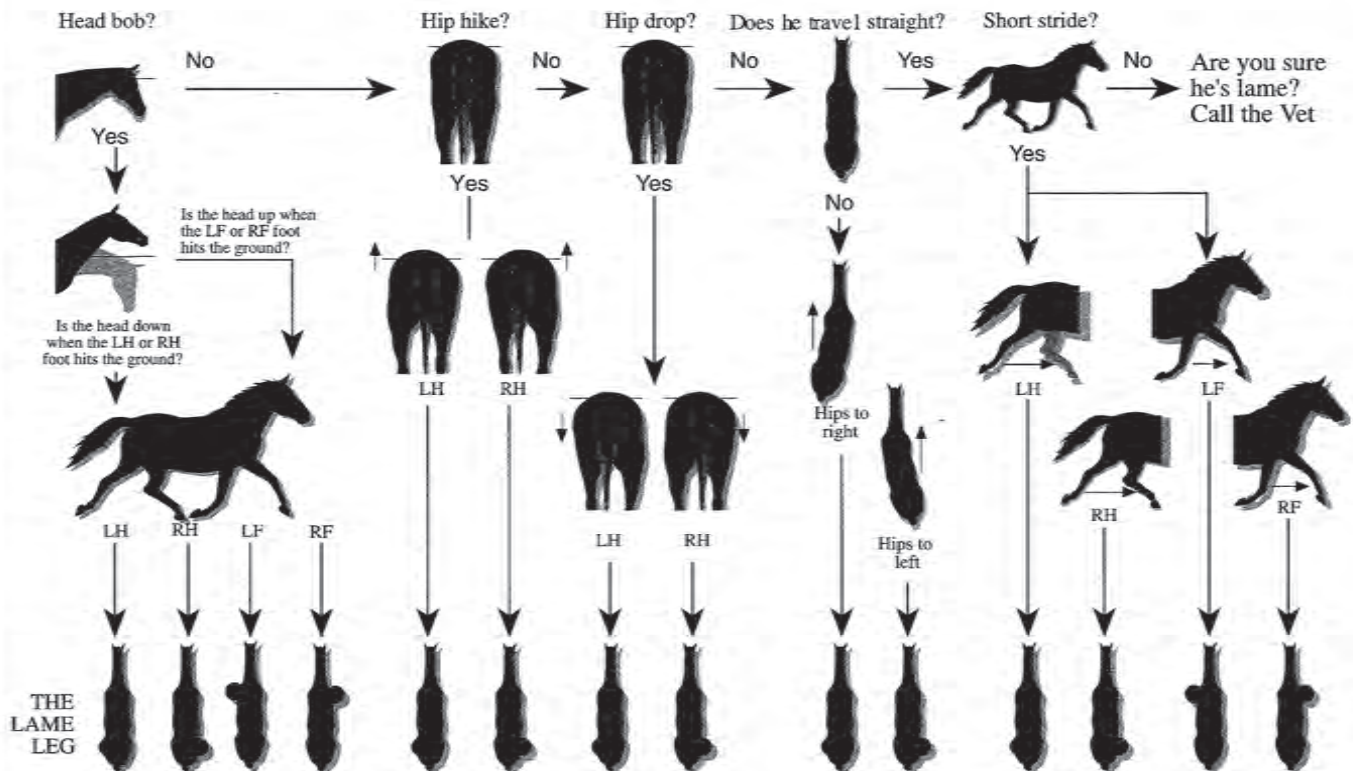

TRPB GOING DIGITAL: LIP TATTOOS TO BE DISCONTINUED BY 2020

The Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau (TRPB), an investigative agency formed in 1946 by the Thoroughbred Racing Associations of North America to protect the integrity of the sport, has announced the introduction of the digital tattoo system, scheduled for full implementation by Jan. 1, 2020.

The announcement was made by J. Curtis Linnell, executive vice president of the TRPB.

The TRPB provides authentication of identity for every Thoroughbred racing in the United States and Canada.

The Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) passed a model rule regarding digital tattoos this past summer. The model rule states, effective by Jan. 1, 2020, the racing secretary shall ensure that the registration certificates for all Thoroughbred horses that were foaled in 2018 or thereafter have a digital tattoo prior to entry in a race.

"With modern technology, specifically the use of microchips, scanners, wireless technology and tablets, a digital tattoo will clearly provide a superior and more robust form of identification," Linnell said. "We want the industry at large, as well as regulators and horse identification officials, not only to be aware of the impending change but to be fully prepared for implementation of the digital tattoo by January 1, 2020." The transition to the TRPB Digital Tattoo follows the recent requirement by The Jockey Club for a horse to be microchipped prior to being registered and, more recently, the availability of a digital certificate of foal registration. The breed registry for Thoroughbreds in North America issued the first digital foal certificate in May.

The software for the digital tattoo was developed by The Jockey Club Technology Services.

"The TRPB's Digital Tattoos are an ideal complement to The Jockey Club's microchip and digital certificate initiatives," said Rick Bailey, The Jockey Club registrar. "We are working closely with the TRPB to ensure that the horse identification system in place in for Thoroughbred racehorses in the U.S. and Canada is thorough as well as technologically advanced."

In essence, the digital tattoo is an electronic validation of the identity of a horse performed by a trained TRPB technician. The technician will use a scanner to read the horse's microchip and the microchip number will hyperlink to electronic registration information.

After fully examining the markings and foal photos contained in the horse's electronic record, the technician will confirm the identity of the horse standing in front of him or her and upload a selection of digital pictures documenting the horse's markings to The Jockey Club's database.

The TRPB technician will then place an electronic embossment on the face photo of the horse and a digital stamp on the electronic certificate of registration.

This digital tattoo will indicate that the TRPB has verified the identity of the horse and uploaded updated digital photographs to the breed registry's database.

TRPB personnel will be meeting with racing officials, regulators, horse identification personnel and various other industry officials through the end of this year and throughout next year to familiarize them with the change. The current practice of branding horses on the inside lip will be discontinued at the end of 2019.

The TRPB website will contain additional information leading up to the rollout of the digital tattoo.

The TRPB, based in Fair Hill, Md., is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations of North America and serves as a national investigative agency in the horse racing industry with the goal of maintaining public confidence in the sport of Thoroughbred racing. Broodmare Management in the Fall

Fall management of broodmares is far more critical than some breeders realize and can directly impact foaling and re-breeding successes next year.

WEANING

Most foals are weaned between four and six months of age. Depending on foaling date, weaning can occur in late summer or early fall. If there are several foals, owners may wait until the younger foals are at least four months old to wean all foals at the same time. On large breeding farms, weaning may occur over several weeks to accommodate the difference in ages of the foals.

Weanling is most commonly done between 4 to 6 months of age.

Weaning has been shown to be stressful to foals. Foals average daily gain decreases after weaning. Foals rebound from the stress of weaning in 10-14 days. Mares are also stressed at weaning but to a lesser extent than their foals.

A major management factor after weaning is getting lactating broodmares dried-up as rapidly as possible. Mastitis is not a big problem in mares, but a few mares do have mastitis.

It is not advisable to milk out mares after weaning. Milking out a mare only stimulates her udder to continue producing milk and prolongs the drying-up process. By not milking out mares, the natural process will result in mares drying up more rapidly and being less stressed.

Mares' udders will be swollen, hot and feverish. If mares are uncomfortable, owners can use camphorated oil or udder balm, commonly applied to cows' udders, to relieve their hot, swollen udders.

It is advisable not to feed grain to mares during the drying-up process. Eliminating grain feeding of mares a week before weaning may also be helpful. Even if mares are thin, (See: Body Condition Score), there is adequate time to properly condition these mares before they will foal and be re-bred next spring.

Exercise is also important in helping the mare dry-up properly and rapidly. Mares should not be kept in stalls after their foals are weaned. Mares can be placed on lower- quality pasture that requires more time to graze. Mares not fed grain or hay will spend more time grazing, thus exercising more, which aids in the drying-up process.

IS SHE STILL PREGNANT?

Owners can more properly manage mares by pregnancy checking them in the fall. Even mares that were pregnant at 14- 18 days and at 40 days post-breeding should be reexamined in the fall. If mares were not pregnancy tested previously, it is suggested that they are checked in the fall. **Fall pregnancy checking** is a wise investment and pays extra dividends in saving feed and labor cost and results in healthier foals next year. While fall pregnancy testing is always important, it is critical when fall pasture is poor, there is a shortage of good-quality hay for winter feeding or feed prices are higher than normal.

Classification of mares as pregnant and non-pregnant allows owners to fine-tune their management. Pregnant and non-pregnant mares need to be managed differently in the fall and winter. Feeding is one key area. There often is a tendency to feed all mares the same type and amount of feed. Barren mares require only a maintenance ration; whereas, pregnant mares need precision-managed feeding during their second and third trimesters.

One of the major advantages of fall pregnancy checking is the identification of mares that were previously pregnant and are now barren. Barren mares are often not given proper attention until late winter or spring just before being bred. This is a good time to correct some reproductive problems which may help get mares pregnant in the next breeding season. Fall is the time to make specific management decisions and actions regarding barren mares.

Barren mares selected to remain in the breeding herd may benefit from a uterine biopsy. A uterine biopsy of the mare's endometrium, lining of the uterus, will indicate the probability of her conceiving and maintaining a pregnancy. Mares with a Grade III biopsy are not likely to maintain a pregnancy. The best time for a uterine biopsy is in the fall after the breeding season and before mares begin transition into winter anestrus. Do not biopsy pregnant mares.

Breeders must decide whether they are going to keep or cull barren mares. Mares 16 years of age and older decline in their ability to maintain a pregnancy. Older mares become pregnant at about the same rate as younger mares, but fewer will be pregnant at 40 days post-breeding and in the fall.

Broodmare Management in the Fall

Two key factors help breeders make this decision. Is the mare an economical producer; in other words, are her foals profitable, and is she a genetically superior producer? Any mare that is not an economical producer certainly must be considered for culling. Those that produce below-average-quality foals will not contribute to a breeder's success.

Fall pregnancy checking is important in mares that grazed endophyte-infected fescue pastures during breeding and were not pregnancy tested earlier. Mares grazing endophyte-infected fescue pastures in the breeding season have a tendency for early embryonic death.

ARTIFICIAL LIGHTS IN THE FALL

Barren mares with high probability of maintaining a pregnancy need to be managed to have the greatest possibility of becoming pregnant next year. This includes **proper nutrition, body condition, health and reproductive management**. It is advisable to place these mares under artificial lights in November or at least by the first of December. Artificial lights will cause these mares to come into estrus about eight weeks after being placed under them and be ready to be bred about 30 days later. The advantage of this process is the barren mare can be mated earlier and more often during the breeding season which enhances her chance of becoming pregnant. Mares placed under lights in November have one or two estrous cycles to combat infections and eliminate difficult problems before being bred.

Placing pregnant mares due to foal in March and April under artificial lights will shorten the length of their gestation by 10 days. By foaling earlier, they can be re-bred sooner in the breeding season.

BODY CONDITION SCORE CONCERNS IN THE FALL

Another management tool is to **monitor body condition score** all broodmares in the fall. Owners can not only separate mares into pregnant and non-pregnant groups, but also place them into groups based on their **body condition score**. For example, pregnant mares could be grouped as thin (BCS 4 or below), moderate (5-7) or fat (8 & 9) for proper management.

Body condition is stored body fat. Stored body fat is used later by the broodmare as an energy source for the rapidly growing fetus in late pregnancy and for milk production in early lactation. Because of the large size of the fetus, it is difficult for pregnant mares to consume adequate feed to meet both the nutritional

needs of the fetus and the mare herself. The fetus has first priority over feed nutrients. The fetus makes 75 percent of its growth in the last trimester. Early lactation has a greater nutritional demand than late pregnancy.

Mares will store body fat until about 270 days of pregnancy. After which, their BCS will decline slightly as the stored fat is used for fetal growth. This decline continues into lactation, especially if the mare is a good milker. Lactating mares tend to lose body condition during the first 120 days of milk production.

Pregnant mares with a BCS of 4 should be managed differently from those with a BCS of 8 or above.

It is possible to add one BCS unit to a mare in 30-45 days. Heavy grain feeding increases the risk of colic and laminitis. Caution and good judgment are required in this process. Mares need to be in the proper body condition desired at foaling (5.5-7.5) at the start of their third trimester.

Mares that have a BCS of 4 or less and are late in their second trimester may need to accumulate body condition faster, which will require feeding more grain. It is normally safe to feed 0.5 pounds of grain per 100 pounds of body weight. A 1,200-pound mare would be fed six pounds of grain daily. If more than six pounds of grain are fed daily, mares should be fed twice per day. These same mares (BCS 4) early in their second trimester have longer to reach a desired body condition, so they can be fed less grain.

In the fall, mares of a BCS of 4 or less need to be fed to increase their weight.

Pregnant broodmares make about 70 percent of their weight gain of pregnancy in the second trimester between 111 and 222 days. Mares in their second trimester should be fed to reach a BCS of 5.5-7.5 by the start of their third trimester at 220 days of pregnancy.

Mares with a BCS of 5.5 to 7.5 foal without problems and are easier to get pregnant than mares that are thin with a BCS of 4 or below. There is no reason for broodmares to have a BCS of 8 (fat) or 9 (obese). These fat mares do not milk as well, and their foals do not grow as rapidly as mares in a moderate BCS range of 5-7.5.

BCS of non-pregnant mares is also a helpful tool, but not as critical as with pregnant mares. An owner has several months to get non-pregnant mares in the desired body condition (5.5-7.5) before the next breeding season.

No detrimental breeding problems occur in mares with a BCS higher than 7.5; however, these fat mares are at greater risk of colic and laminitis, and it is not economically good management to have them above a



BCS of 7.5. Many non-pregnant mares will have a BCS of 5-7.5. They must be managed in the fall and winter to maintain this level of body condition without getting fatter. Non-pregnant mares with a BCS of 8-9 in the fall should be placed on a diet to reduce their BCS to at least a 7.5. Owners have several months before the breeding season to accomplish this feat. These mares should be on lower-quality fall pasture without grain. In winter, they should be fed an average or slightly lower-quality hay without grain.

GROUPING MARES RELATED TO FOALING DATE

Pregnant mares can be further subdivided depending on when they will foal. Mares that foal early in the year, especially if they have a BCS of 4 or less, need immediate intense management to increase their body condition before foaling. Likewise, overfat mares (BCS 8 and 9) need critical management. If they foal early in the year, they should be managed so as not to gain any more body condition.

It is not advisable to have mares lose body condition in their last trimester. If fat mares (BCS 8 or 9) are early in their pregnancy, owners have time and options to better manage them. Use of pasture and forage with little or no grain could result in these mares reducing to a BCS score of between 7.5 to 6 when they foal. These mares can graze on lower-quality fall pasture without grain so they will be nearer a body BCS of 7.5 at the start of their last trimester.

FALL FEEDING MANAGEMENT

As noted, careful nutritional management of broodmares is important in the fall and winter. The general tendency is for **broodmares** to be overfed. Allowing mares to get too fat in early pregnancy is a definite problem. Mares that do not milk well and those that are not pregnant have a tendency to be too fat.

Fall pasture should be the basis of the feeding program for all broodmares. Pregnant mares with BCS of 5.5-7.5 need to be maintained at this level. Normally, high-quality fall pasture will be sufficient. Pregnant mares may even improve their BCS on good-quality fall pasture. Pregnant mares are more efficient than non-pregnant mares.

Monitor fall pastures for maintaining pregnant mares at optimum body condition scores.

This may not be the case if pasture is limited or of poor-quality. Mares may require some grain to maintain their body condition. Always feed the

smallest amount of grain to accomplish the nutrition level required.

Thin mares or those on lower-quality fall pasture may require an increase of 10-15 percent in grain fed above their nutrient needs. Non-pregnant mares can be well maintained on good-quality pasture alone. Different nutrient needs are the reason that pregnant and non-pregnant mares should be managed separately. The best-quality pasture should be reserved for weanlings.

Astute mare owners know the reproductive and lactational histories of their mares. Mares that are known to be heavy milkers can be preconditioned in the fall and winter. These mares can have a BCS of about 7.5, since heavy lactation will reduce their body condition.

While the mare can store body fat for later use, she has little reserves of protein that can be used for fetal growth and/or milk production. In the second and last trimester, from 111 days to foaling, protein intake is important. The total ration should contain 10-12 percent protein, especially in the 9th, 10th and 11th months of pregnancy. If legume forages are fed, a 10-12 percent protein grain mix is adequate. One should feed a 12-14 percent protein grain mix with grass hays. Since the mare cannot store much protein, feeding a 16 percent protein ration is not recommended during pregnancy. Proteins are made up of a series of amino acids. Protein quality is having the correct amounts of essential amino acids in proper ratios to each other. Research indicates that protein quality may be more important in early pregnancy than was previously thought. A high quality protein such as soybean meal, alfalfa hay or milk by-product sources should be fed in the last three months of pregnancy as well as in early lactation.

It is important that all mares have an adequate source of clean, fresh water and trace mineralized salt at all times.

VACCINATION

Mares are normally vaccinated in the spring for the common horse diseases. Equine herpesvirus Type 1 causes virus abortion, which is the single most important infectious cause of abortion. Pregnant mares should be vaccinated for Rhinopneumonitis (virus abortion) in their 5th, 7th and 9th months of pregnancy. Depending when a mare became pregnant, possibly the 5th, probably the 7th and certainly the 9th month of pregnancy will occur in the fall or winter.

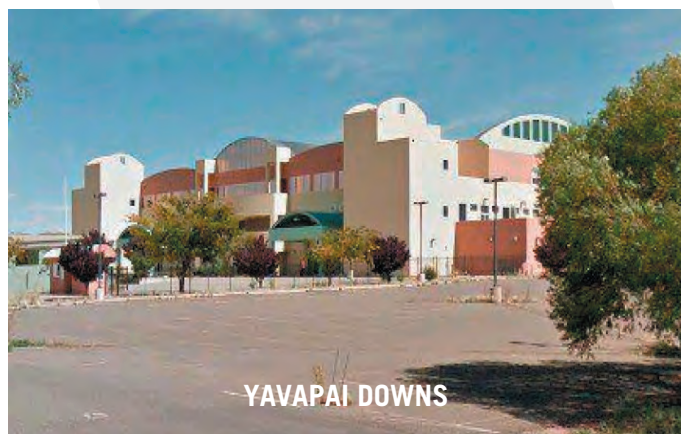

BREEDING PLANNING: SELECTING A SIRE

When you drive by a farm and see a bright, playful young foal romping in a lush pasture with his dam, it's easy to forget how much work, money, and planning went into his breeding. Many people underestimate the planning that goes into a useful, profitable mating.

The first step in the process is getting the opinion of a qualified veterinarian as to whether your mare can and should be bred. You should also determine the approximate value and usefulness of the resulting foal, and the cost involved. Many horse owners fail to consider costs other than the stud fee, including care specific to the pregnant mare (such as ultrasound examinations) and the veterinarian's charges for delivering the foal. There's also routine veterinary care of the new foal, along with additional farriers costs, stable space, feed and pasture.

Once the veterinarian says the mare is sound for breeding and you've planned your budget, you can begin selecting a stallion for your mare and agreeing to the breeding contract. Naturally, you want to pick a stallion that's strong in any area your mare is weaker, but how do you do this systematically? You need to evaluate his confirmation, performance of other offspring, pedigree, and any physical problems or unsoundness.

CHOOSING A STALLION

But how do you decide which stallion to use? Basic to all considerations is the stallion's confirmation.

"The anatomical structures making up the horse determine its conformation, including its size," says Rowen D Frandson, DVM, MS, retired chairman of the Department of Anatomy at Colorado State University's College of veterinary Medicine and co-author of *Anatomy and Physiology of Farm Animals*. For years this book has been the most widely used undergraduate college anatomy textbook in animal science program across America. Frandson has long been interested in the relationship between conformation and performance in horses.

Frandson says, "The conformation of the offspring is expected to be somewhere between that of the sire and the dam. Conformation is reflecting in the characteristics of each breed. Conformation of the parents, whether good or bad, is likely to be transmitted to the offspring, with desirable or undesirable results. If the sire and the dam each have the anatomical characteristics (conformation) of the breed they represent, the offspring should be representative of the breed." The stallion, therefore, should be strong in those points in which the mare is relatively weak.

Breeding to a stallion that is configurationally better than the mare gives your prospective foal a better chance of improving upon the mare, of course. Avoid selecting a mediocre stallion and expecting your mare's good conformation points to overshadow his weak points. You might get lucky, but it's a much better idea to start with the best genetic material possible in the stallion since your mare is the unchanging factor.

OFFSPRING AND PEDIGREE

Besides his conformation, you need to know how well the stallion's get have been doing in the field in which you hope to use the foal. Notice that it is more important to know how the stallion's get have been doing in that field than how the stallion himself has done. Of course, sometimes the stallion isn't enough to have two or three crops of offspring with performance records. Then you will have to base your decision on the record of the stallion himself and the get of his full or half-siblings. In such cases, though, the stud fee should be lower than that of a stallion which has several crops in the field whose get have done exceptionally well in competition.

An astute breeder will have studied the field (racing, showing, trail-raiding, dressage, hunting, etc.) Enough to know the names and pedigrees of the most successful (proven) stallions. This helps you identify the best among the bloodlines.

If the stallion's get have yet to preform, you must give extra consideration to the grand sires and grand dams. Beyond that, although their names can look wonderful on the pedigree, third and fourth generation progenitors seldom have made much contribution to the prospective sire. An exception to this guideline might occur if a substantial amount of inbreeding

is involved, which is practiced to "fix" certain desirable traits and thus greatly increase the odds that those traits also will be present in the offspring.

Unfortunately, inbreeding does the same for undesirable characteristics, which is one reason it is not practiced more. The other powerful reason for limiting its practice is the frequent loss of vigor in the offspring of lines that have been heavily inbred. To remedy this latter problem, the stallion owners or stud managers probably have out crossed to a different line somewhere within a generation or two.

If inbreeding is a concern, it is useful to determine the inbreeding coefficient of the stallion. The level of inbreeding that's considered acceptable varies with the breed and the breeder, but most breeders will draw a line in the neighborhood of 15-16%.

The inbreeding coefficient for thoroughbreds, on average, is somewhere around 85. Any individual, however, usually obtainable by studying the breed history, and have already been obtained by experts in many instances. In such cases you would want to know if the stallion you are considering is inbred to a higher or to a lower degree than the average of the breed. You certainly will want to know how the foal compares, and so will anyone considering buying the foal at a yearling sale or thereafter.

In evaluating siblings, sires, dams, grand sires and grand dams, the careful breeder will profit from at least a brief study of equine genetics. For instance, a given sire or dam will not necessarily pass the same genes to every offspring. Some sires, however, are known to be prepotent, meaning they seem to pass their good qualities along to their offspring no matter the mare's qualifications.

Because horse often possess some genes that are suppressed by the influence of others, full siblings can be entirely different from each other in certain traits and almost identical in others. This is due to one foal inheriting the dominant gene and the other inheriting the suppresses (recessive) gene. Unfortunately, there is no way for a breeder to know which alleles the horse will receive before breeding. Here the law of average holds. That law says that the chances of getting the combination of genes you want is much greater if the sire's offspring and the offspring of the sire's siblings and half-siblings have the characteristics you want.

EVALUATING PHYSICAL PROBLEMS

Another consideration is the number and kind of physical defects in the stallion (every stallion has at least one or two).

Some of these are the result of heredity; others, probably the majority, are the result of environment (what happened to the stallion during and after birth) For instance, a crooked leg could be the result of an accident, or he could have been born with it. Keep in mind that the stallion's conformation might have been responsible for the defect.

Unsoundness in the stallion is another matter entirely. If the stallion is unsound, you have a red flag warning you to consider carefully breeding to him. Blindness is one or both eyes, for instance, might or might not be inherited.

Evaluate the circumstances under which the horse became unsound. For example, conformation likely had nothing to do with a leg injury received from steeping in a gopher hole. However, severe arthritis after a career of mild work such as pleasure riding might have roots in poor joint conformation that you don't want your foal to have. Even if the unsoundness itself is not transmissible, the tendency to acquire it after birth might be so. "Faulty conformation may predispose to unsoundness," says Frandson, "and that may cause rejection of the animal for the purpose it was intended."

An advisor might recommend disqualifying on general grounds any stallion which is unsound for any reason. Many advisors, however, would not go quite that far, choosing instead to evaluate the unsoundness relative to the horse's designated discipline. For example, lameness that only shows up after full-speed race work might be perfectly acceptable for a Western pleasure candidate.

Nevertheless, if the stallion under consideration is unsound, you should discuss the matter with a qualified equine veterinarian before signing a breeding contract.

NEED HELP?

The extension horse specialist for your state or your county agricultural agent (both of whom can be located by checking the local telephone directory under "Cooperative Extension Service") can be helpful in evaluating potential sires. The careful breeder also will check the reputation of agents and stud managers before seeking their advice or deciding on a sire.

The extension horse specialist works for the public and is paid with public funds, not private ones. The law requires that he/she be available to consult with every citizen who needs help in any field in which he/she is experienced. You need not be a full-time or even part-time farmer to ask for help.

In most cases, bloodstock agents or even top breeders with many stallions at their disposal can also help you work out sire selection issues. Genetics texts such as those listed below might also prove helpful in understanding breeding planning challenges.

Perhaps the most appropriate closing statement is one that has floating around for decades, if not centuries: You can look at a horse and know what he/she seems to be; you can study the pedigree and know what the horse ought to be; but only the offspring can tell you what horse really is!

This Pedigree Cross Index allows a breeder to nick, inbreed or outcross his broodmares by easy reference. Indexed are the names of sires and dams included within the first three generations of all the stallions in the 2019 Stallion Directory.

Example: AFFIRMED - Charlie Barley, Mystery Storm, Peteski

In the above example, Affirmed appears in one of the first 3 generations of all the stallions listed after him.

Suppose a breeder has a mare that is a granddaughter of Mr. Prospector or has crosses of that sire in a mare's pedigree. He may want to breed her to a stallion with Northern Dancer blood to take advantage of the Northern Dancer--Mr. Prospector nick. By looking up "Northern Dancer" in this index, he can quickly see all the stallions in this register that have Northern Dancer appearing in one of the first three generations of their pedigrees.

If a breeder's mare is a granddaughter of Seattle Slew, he may wish to inbreed to that stallion and thereby get more of Seattle Slew's makeup in the foal. By checking "Seattle Slew" in the index, the breeder can readily find all the advertised stallions that have Seattle Slew in their pedigrees.

What if a breeder's mare is already inbred or linebred? She might have 2 or 3 crosses of Deputy Minister in her first four generations for example. The breeder may want to make sure the stallion he chooses for his mare has no Deputy Minister or no Deputy Minister up close in his pedigree. By looking up "Deputy Minister" in the index, he can readily see the stallions in this Stallion Register he should avoid for his mare.

Any stallion that stands the entire breeding season in Arizona, and files a copy of the The Jockey Club Report of Mares bred for that breeding season with the ATBA office, that stallion (s) offspring will be eligible to race in the Stallion Stakes Derby.

WHAT THIS MEANS TO YOU AS A STALLION OWNER.

All 2019 foals of Arizona Stallions (standing the full 2017 breeding season in Arizona) will be eligible to enter the 2021 Stallion Stakes derby. This should create an exciting race as there are no early nominations, or late fees.

Stallion owners must send a copy of the Jockey Club Report of Mares Bred to the ATBA office each breeding season. This is mandatory if your stallions offspring is to have the opportunity to participate.

Foals need not be Arizona-bred, but must be by a stallion standing the full season in Arizona and a copy of the Report of Mares bred on file with the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders office.

The Arizona Stallion Stakes Derby is a restricted race for the offspring of Arizona Stallions.
