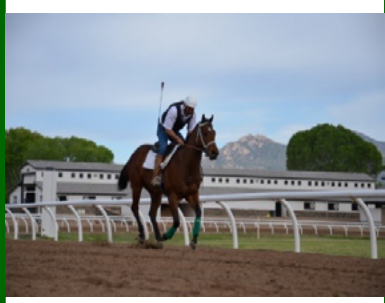
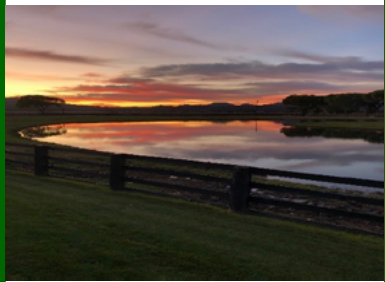
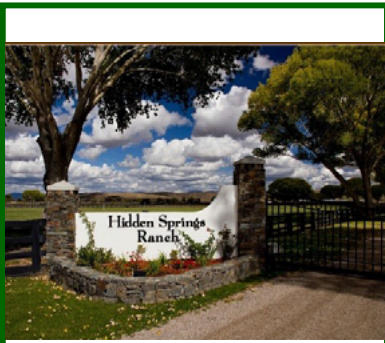

IRS Rejects Taxpayer Argument

In a new case, the Tax Court ruled that a Phoenix, Arizona physician's horse breeding and racing activity was not engaged in for profit even though the taxpayer developed a business plan and kept business records. The case, *Timothy Kuberski v. IRS* [RIA TC Memo 2002-200] appeared to hinge in part upon the judge's evaluation of the taxpayer's own testimony, which he found unpersuasive.

The judge said that the taxpayer, while he apparently had business plans, did not use these plans to improve the profitability of his activity. The taxpayer testified that he made economic forecasts and otherwise conducted the activity in a businesslike manner, but the operation's 28-year loss history seemed to suggest, to the judge, that this allowed the taxpayer to offset substantial income from his medical practice. Also, the taxpayer did not show that he had relied upon experts in conducting the activity. The taxpayer represented himself in court rather than being represented by a tax attorney, which is never a good idea. It is always important to hire experienced tax counsel if you have a serious tax matter.

The taxpayer believed that he could breed a better-than-average thoroughbred horse because of his medical background and his understanding of physiology and statistical analysis. He is a licensed trainer as well as a certified horse appraiser. He had taken annual classes on taxes, business, shoeing horses, veterinary problems, animal husbandry, and sales preparation. He had written several articles for the thoroughbred horse industry, including one explaining the dosage system, a horse breeding theory, and others on various equine medical problems.

One of the main reasons why the taxpayer lost this case was that he failed to introduce credible evidence with respect to certain factual issues. A competent attorney could have prevented this from happening. The judge emphasized that in order for the taxpayer to prevail with respect to claiming successive years of losses in a horse-related activity, the taxpayer must establish that he engaged in the activity with the primary, predominant, or principal purpose and intent of realizing an economic profit independent of tax savings. The taxpayer's expectation need not be a reasonable one, but the profit motive must be bona-fide. Greater weight is given to objective facts than to the taxpayer's self-serving testimony regarding his intent.

The taxpayer claimed that he kept detailed and well thought out business plans, maintained business account records with yearly profit and loss statements, filed stallion reports and reports of all broodmares and registered all foals with the Jockey Club, used a bookkeeping service, used business stationery and a business checking account, made a yearly assessment of the market, culled nonproductive mares or poorly marketable horses, made an economic forecast of each horse's productivity, and tracked the annual cost of getting each mare and foal to the thoroughbred sales. However, the judge felt that the taxpayer's arguments were not persuasive and were simply copied from the tax guides for horse owners that were also introduced into evidence.

Also, the judge found the taxpayer's testimony somewhat vague on the issue of how he conducted the breeding and racing operations. The taxpayer's testimony was uncorroborated by witnesses or documents.

The judge said that even though there were adequate business records the taxpayer did not include analyses on why large losses recurred over a long period and whether any possibility of recouping them existed.

The court was careful to mention that a continuous series of losses during the start-up phase of a horse activity will not necessarily be deemed indicative that the activity was not engaged in for profit. However, the cumulative loss of the taxpayer over the years was about \$888,000. While the start-up phase of a horse activity is from 5 to 10 years, in this case the years at issue were well beyond the period customarily necessary to bring a similar operation to profitable status.

Sometimes taxpayers can explain losses based on unforeseen circumstances such as lawsuits against the business, downturns in business, changes in the purse structure at races, a decrease in Breeder's awards, and death or problems with important horses. However, the taxpayer in this case presented no evidence other than his own testimony to corroborate these claims.

The judge said that the taxpayer's level of income permitted him to continue the horse activity without a profit. If he had regarded the activity as a business, he would have focused more on the financial aspects and ways to cut losses.

Finally, the taxpayer claimed that his farm land appreciated in value over the years and should be considered when analyzing whether the requisite profit motive exists. However, he failed to provide a formal appraisal of the value of the land.

Her determination and love for everyone (two legged and four legged) will forever echo around the barns and grandstands of Arizona and California racing. She was missed at the ATBA Fall Sale this year but her consignment did very well. She would have been very proud of the crew that represented Bar Diamond Ranch.

Pearson is survived by her husband, Regan Anderson, her sister Leslie, niece Chelse Griggs, mother-in-law Jane Anderson, and her stepchildren.

On November 12, a memorial service was held at Turf Paradise in the winners circle. Her family extended heart-felt thanks to everyone for the outpouring of help, love and support over the last couple of months.

Dealing With Equine Colic

Here are 33 Do's and Don'ts

Do you know what to do—and just as importantly, what not to do—if your horse displays vague, mild, or serious signs of what might be colic? Your answer could save your horse's life.

The changes indicating colic were subtle but nevertheless concerning. Rufus, a Thoroughbred/Warmblood jumper, wasn't himself, recalls owner Sydney Durieux of New York City. "Rufus was always attentive, playful almost, wrapping his neck around you and giving you a kind of hug, straining his neck to reach you," she describes.

But that evening Rufus ignored Durieux and just stared, looking distracted and vaguely uncomfortable. "He wasn't swaying, pawing, or looking at his stomach, but when the trainer listened to Rufus' belly, she couldn't detect any sounds," she says.

After a half-hour, Durieux trailered him to a veterinary hospital an hour away. "Both the trainer and I thought we might be overreacting, but our hunch was right: The veterinarian said Rufus had colic and needed immediate surgery," she says. "I was shocked, because every other horse I'd seen with colic had been very distressed.

Is it, Or Isn't It Colic?

That's the trouble with colic: You just can't tell what you're dealing with. Sometimes it's pretty obvious something is painfully wrong and the veterinarian should be summoned. Other times mild clinical signs might accurately reflect a mild colic that easily and quickly responds to minimal management without a vet even seeing the horse. Then there are those times when mild clinical signs don't indicate the severity of a problem that could result in death if treatment is delayed.

Do you know what to do—and just as importantly, what not to do—if your horse displays vague, mild, or serious signs of what might be colic? How do you handle the situation? Actions to take/avoid with your horse's recovery plan? How to minimize the risk for colic in the first place?

The following are 33 tips to use as guidelines.

When Your Horse First Shows Signs of Colic

Colic 101

The term "colic" refers to abdominal pain rather than a specific disorder. Conditions that commonly cause colic include gas, impaction, grain overload, sand ingestion, and parasite infection.

"Any horse has the ability to experience colic," states Dr. Michael N. Fugaro. "The disorder is indiscriminate of age, sex, breed, occupation, or environment."

Diagnosis, says Dr. Amy Plummer Weatherly, is generally based on physical exam (intestinal sounds, temperature, pulse, respiration rates, rectal palpation, and mucous membrane color), abdominocentesis (removal of abdominal fluid for assessment) and/or nasogastric intubation, abdominal ultrasound, sometimes abdominal radiographs, and blood tests.

With appropriate and timely treatment, the prognosis for medical colics is very good to excellent, and for surgical colics that receive immediate treatment is good to excellent.

1. DO check your horse's vital signs. "Check your horse's heart rate and rectal temperature," suggests Dr. James Carmalt. "Also check his hooves for heat and his rump muscles for tightness: These may reflect laminitis and tying-up, respectively, which can mimic colic/abdominal pain."

2. DO look for the presence of feces in the stall or pen, adds Carmalt. Absent or reduced amounts of manure could indicate a problem.

3. DO call your veterinarian immediately, regardless of the severity or vagueness of the signs. Waiting too long could allow minor problems to become severe and severe problems to become untreatable.

Relate your horse's vital signs and describe his clinical signs. "The vet can ask questions over the phone to better assess whether a veterinarian needs to examine the animal at that time or if the owner can just monitor the horse and summon the veterinarian if signs worsen," says Dr. Amy Plummer Weatherly.

4. DON'T use a wait-and-see approach before talking with your veterinarian. "There is definitely danger in delaying calling the veterinarian, especially with some forms of colic," Weatherly warns. "If a horse is painful because of excess fluid in his stomach, the horse could rupture his stomach; once this occurs, there is no treatment that will save him. This can happen in a relatively short amount of time, within hours from the onset of clinical signs."

5. DO closely monitor your horse for as long as it takes. "Many people have the misconception that they can go and do errands and come back in a couple of hours to see how the horse is doing," says Fugaro. "Your horse's clinical signs and condition can worsen very, very quickly. You've got to check your horse every 15 to 20 minutes." Feed a consistent diet and make any changes slowly.

Feed an appropriate hay and offer it free choice.

Feed concentrates as small, frequent meals. Do not feed more than 4 pounds of concentrate per meal.

Maintain a consistent daily feeding schedule. Supplement your horse with a high-quality digestive supplement such as Neigh-Lox® Advanced. Its multi-pronged approach supports complete GI tract health, and reduces the risk of ulcers, digestive upset, and hindgut imbalances.

6. DO walk your horse, if it's safe and recommended by your veterinarian, to stimulate gut motility and to prevent injury from rolling. "Greater than 50% of mild colics will clear up with just that (walking)," says Dr. Daniel P. Keenan. He recommends 45-60 minutes of brisk walking. However, walking too much can exhaust a horse, so only walk him enough to keep him from going down and rolling.

7. DON'T exercise aggressively, as vigorous exercise slows gut motility and can lead to exhaustion when the horse needs to retain fluid and energy, Fugaro states.

8. DON'T permit access to feed (hay, grass, or grain), as food could exacerbate the problem. Even when colicking, some horses will still want to eat, perhaps even gorge themselves, as a response to pain.

9. DO withhold access to water until the veterinarian can examine the horse and pass a stomach tube. If the stomach is distended, allowing the horse to drink could result in a ruptured stomach.

10. DON'T medicate without your veterinarian's approval, as pain medications can mask clinical signs, making it more difficult to get a timely, accurate diagnosis.

11. DON'T overmedicate. "An appropriate dose of Banamine (flunixin meglumine) as recommended by the veterinarian should last 24 hours," Fugaro explains, although some veterinarians point out that Banamine often requires administration every 12 hours at the appropriate dose. "

If the horse is not responding to a painkiller, it is not because you didn't use enough medication, it's because the condition is beyond what that medication can do."

Furthermore, overdosing can cause gastric ulceration, colitis, and renal problems, although these don't occur for several days. If colic persists more than 20 to 30 minutes after Banamine administration, call your veterinarian. Lack of response to pain medication is a key indicator for the need to refer for further evaluation.

12. DON'T administer anything via a nasogastric tube or syringe mineral oil into the horse's mouth. If done incorrectly and the horse aspirates it into the lungs, he could die, warns Weatherly.

13. DON'T administer enemas. "The rectum of a horse is extremely fragile, and you can get a rectal tear," says Fugaro. "Rectal tears lead to a secondary peritonitis (inflammation of the abdominal lining), which is often fatal."

14. DO keep your horse contained in a safe area, such as a small pasture or large box stall, where he can't get cast or knock into things, suggests Weatherly. "Separate a mare from her young foal to prevent injury to the foal. If possible, move the foal to an area where the mare can still see her baby." Just realize that this scenario might create more anxiety for the mare, so it will be a management decision that requires sound judgment.

15. DO start thinking about preparing for trailering at the onset of clinical signs, Keenan says. "Who can you call to borrow a trailer or to help you with transport? Are the trailer tires inflated? Is your trailer operable and ready to go?" Ideally, you should have a contingency plan for trailering prior to encountering a colic that might require referral. It's also a good idea to maintain your truck/trailer so they are ready in

an emergency such as this. Why Do Today's Horses Have So Much Trouble With Their Digestive System?

In the wild, the horse is intended to be a grazer. Horses eat all day long and meet their energy requirements solely from the forages and seeds they find in the environment. They not only survive but flourish on relatively low-quality forages.

Thanks to humans, domesticated horse has practically unlimited sources of energy and nutrients. We've provided improved grasses in lush pasture; we've mixed grains to provide energy-dense meals; we've harvested their forages to optimize nutrition. We have contained horses in stalls and fed them on specific schedules, restricting grazing time and introducing large meals. Through these actions we have made the horse more susceptible to ulcers, tissue damage from pH changes, and imbalances in the microbial populations that lead to digestive upset and colic.

As a horse owner, you can reduce the chances of digestive upset by following a few easy steps. Here are six feeding tips to reduce digestive upset: Provide an unlimited source of clean water.

16. DO trailer the horse, if possible, in a trailer without dividers. This reduces the chance of your horse getting cast under a partition, Weatherly says. However, many colicking horses trailer fine, and the confinement the divider provides seems to help. This is something that needs to be thought through prior to an emergency.

17. DON'T ride in the trailer. "It's unsafe," says Weatherly. "There is nothing you can do, anyway, to help once your horse is loaded." horse with bellyband

When Your Horse Needs Medical or Surgical Treatment

18. DON'T deviate from your veterinarian's treatment plan, cautions Carmalt. Administer medications correctly and follow the recommended protocol for the complete duration prescribed. If you have concerns, ask your veterinarian before making any changes.

19. DO monitor the incision site daily if your horse required surgery. Call your veterinarian if there are adverse changes in your horse's appetite, behavior, demeanor, or in the appearance of the incision.

20. DON'T place your hands or fingers on the surgical incision. "This increases the risk of incisional infection," Carmalt states. However, the horse probably shouldn't be released from the hospital as long as this potential remains.

21. DO discuss postoperative complications and home-care instructions with your vet before going home with your postop horse, urges Weatherly. Get a clear understanding of what you're supposed to do.

Reducing Colic Risk in Your Horse and Being Prepared

22. DO maintain a consistent feeding protocol and introduce feed changes gradually. "The most common association with colic is a change in feed or hay batch within the prior two weeks," says Keenan. When switching to a new food source, try to do so gradually over at least 10 days.

23. DO feed frequently. Says Weatherly, "Multiple smaller meals are generally better for the digestive tract than one or two large meals." The most important part of feeding is consistency with the total amount of feed (energy) given to the horse each day and sticking with a routine.

24. DO forgo grain over forage. "Horses' intestinal tracts are not made to digest grain," Keenan says. In fact, high-grain diets are linked to increased incidence of colic as well as founder, obesity, and other disorders. "The only horses that need grain are those that lose weight despite being fed good-quality hay 24/7 or those that are in a very demanding exercise schedule."

25. DO encourage drinking to reduce risk of impaction colic. Provide access to warm water in the winter and cool water in the summer. Tempt horses that routinely don't

drink much by mixing ample amounts of water into grain, gradually increasing the water:grain ratio. "You can slowly increase the water to the point where the horse will drink a whole bucket of water to get to a half pound of grain," says Keenan. "Do that twice a day, and you've got them drinking two buckets of water a day." Do not allow the grain to ferment.

26. DO provide regular exercise. "Keeping an exercise routine consistent is beneficial," says Weatherly. This includes regular turnout, as well. Avoid "weekend warrior" activities or intense bouts of exercise followed by long periods without exercise.

27. DO maintain an approved parasite control routine. "Your veterinarian can determine an appropriate program based on the pasture and age of your horse," Weatherly says. Research suggests strategic parasite control is optimal; owners should contact their vets to design a program based on fecal egg counts and pasture management. Nonstrategic rotational deworming causes parasite resistance to anthelmintic (parasite-killing) drugs and is no longer recommended.

28. DO take steps to reduce ingestion of sand. Keep hay off sandy surfaces by placing rations in a manger, cut-down garbage can or rain barrel (ensuring there are no sharp edges), or on a cement pad or rubber mat swept clean of sand. If your horse likes to pull his hay out of the container and eat it off the ground, lay mats around the container.

29. DO check stool samples of horses prone to sand colic. "Put about two cups of manure in a gallon Ziploc bag, fill the bag with water, close the bag tightly, then shake it up until all of the manure is dissolved," Keenan advises. "Hold the bag by one corner so the opposite corner is hanging lowest. Tap the bag and the sand will settle out in the lower corner. If your horse has more than half a teaspoon, he's

positive for sand ingestion. If you get a negative, repeat the test three or four times over a three-day period to make sure.”

30. DO administer psyllium products, according to your vet’s instructions, if your horse has a sand burden, suggests Keenan. Keep your horse off sandy areas until the problem clears.

31. DO consider management changes if your horse has colicked before. “Ask your veterinarian if there are specific things you can do to decrease the chance of colic,” says Weatherly. “For example, a feed or housing change.”

32. DO consider gastric ulcer prevention methods for highly stressed horses or performance horses, per veterinary instructions, says Keenan. “Make sure these horses get endoscopic exams, as ulcers are a common cause of mild colic.”

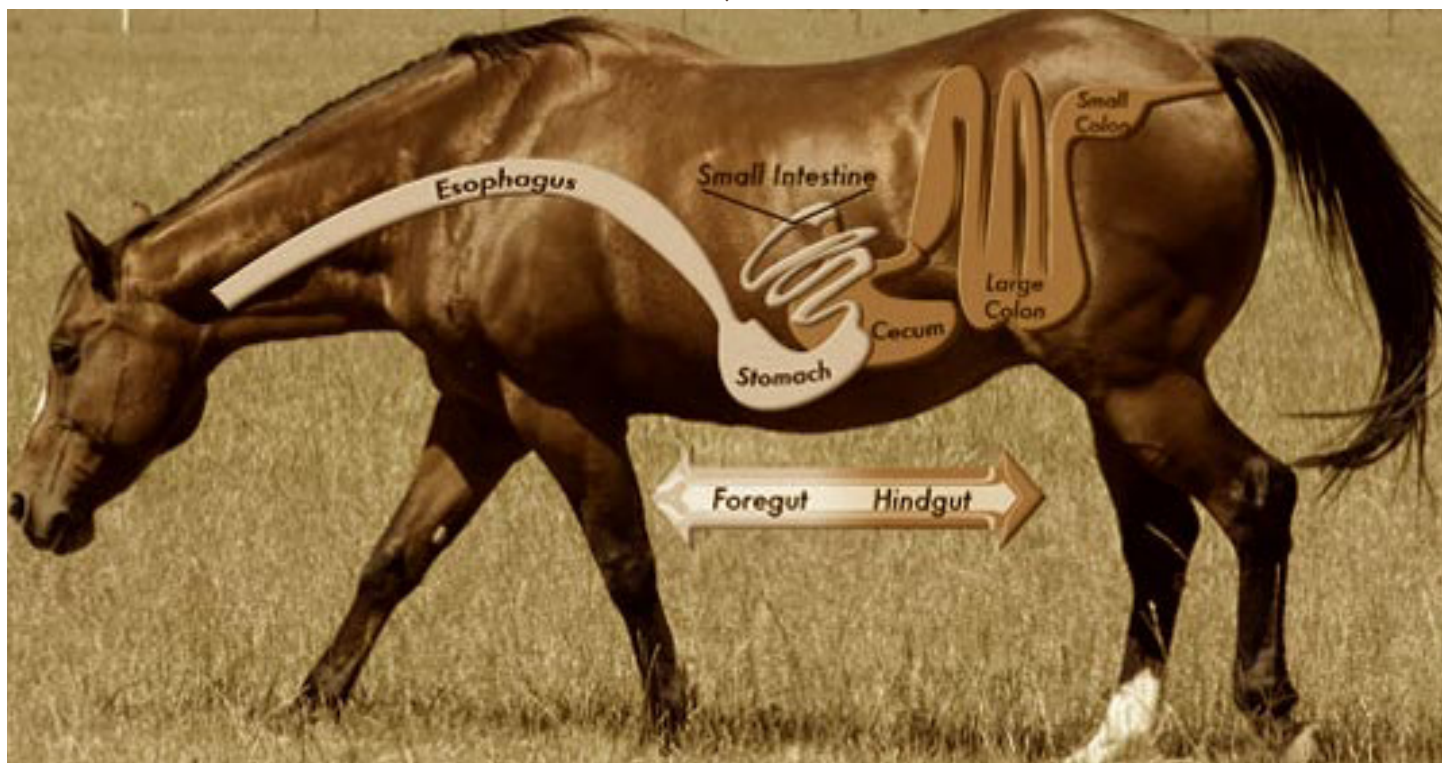
33. DO consider getting major medical (not just surgical) insurance to cover the costs of advanced medical and surgical care for your horse. It is not as expensive as you might think and can save you the stress of wondering where to come up with a large sum of money to save your horse.

Take-Home Message About Equine Colic

Colic can be resolved easily about 90% of the time, but it can also be the end of your horse’s life.

Don’t be misled by mild signs and conclude it’s a do-it-yourself solution: While that could be the case, the price of a phone consultation with your vet is much less costly and painful than dealing with a worsening surgical situation or the angst of a euthanasia that might not have been necessary if you’d acted sooner.

Sydney Durieux’s quick decision to have Rufus examined paid off: “He came back faster and fitter than ever and continues to do well!”

Breeding Planning: Selective A Sire

When you drive by a farm and see a bright, playful young foal romping in a lush pasture with his dam, it's easy to forget how much work, money, and planning went into his breeding. Many people underestimate the planning that goes into a useful, profitable mating.

The first step in the process is getting the opinion of a qualified veterinarian as to whether your mare can and should be bred. You should also determine the approximate value and usefulness of the resulting foal, and the cost involved. Many horse owners fail to consider costs other than the stud fee, including care specific to the pregnant mare (such as ultrasound examinations) and the veterinarian's charges for delivering the foal. There's also routine veterinary care of the new foal, along with additional farriers costs, stable space, feed and pasture.

Once the veterinarian says the mare is sound for breeding and you've planned your budget, you can begin selecting a stallion for your mare and agreeing to the breeding contract. Naturally, you want to pick a stallion that's strong in any area your mare is weaker, but how do you do this systematically? You need to evaluate his confirmation, performance of other offspring, pedigree, and any physical problems or unsoundness.

CHOOSING A STALLION

But how do you decide which stallion to use? Basic to all considerations is the stallion's confirmation.

"The anatomical structures making up the horse determine its conformation, including its size," says Rowen D Frandson, DVM, MS, retired chairman of the Department of Anatomy at Colorado State University's College of Veterinary Medicine and co-author of *Anatomy and Physiology of Farm Animals*. For years this book has been the most widely used undergraduate college anatomy textbook in animal science program across America. Frandson has long been interested in the relationship between conformation and performance in horses.

Frandson says, "The conformation of the offspring is expected to be somewhere between that of the sire and the dam. Conformation is reflecting in the characteristics of each breed. Conformation of the parents, whether good or bad, is likely to be transmitted to the offspring, with desirable or undesirable results. If the sire and the dam each have the anatomical characteristics (conformation) of the breed they represent, the offspring should be representative of the breed." The stallion, therefore,

should be strong in those points in which the mare is relatively weak.

Breeding to a stallion that is configurationally better than the mare gives your prospective foal a better chance of improving upon the mare, of course. Avoid selecting a mediocre stallion and expecting your mare's good conformation points to overshadow his weak points. You might get lucky, but it's a much better idea to start with the best genetic material possible in the stallion since your mare is the unchanging factor.

OFFSPRING AND PEDIGREE

Besides his conformation, you need to know how well the stallion's get have been doing in the field in which you hope to use the foal. Notice that it is more important to know how the stallion's get have been doing in that field than how the stallion himself has done. Of course, sometimes the stallion isn't enough to have two or three crops of offspring with performance records. Then you will have to base your decision on the record of the stallion himself and the get of his full or half-siblings. In such cases, though, the stud fee should be lower than that of a stallion which has several crops in the field an whose get have done exceptionally well in competition.

An astute breeder will have studied the field (racing, showing, trail-raiding, dressage, hunting, etc.) Enough to know the names and pedigrees of the most successful (proven) stallions. This helps you identify the best among the bloodlines.

If the stallion's get have yet to perform, you must give extra consideration to the grand sires and grand dams. Beyond that, although their names can look wonderful on the pedigree, third and fourth generation progenitors seldom have made much contribution to the prospective sire. An exception to this guideline might occur if a substantial amount of inbreeding is involved, which is practiced to "fix" certain desirable traits and thus greatly increase the odds that those traits also will be present in the offspring.

Unfortunately, inbreeding does the same for undesirable characteristics, which is one reason it is not practiced more. The other powerful reason for limiting its practice is the frequent loss of vigor in the offspring of lines that have been heavily inbred. To remedy this latter problem, the stallion owners or stud managers probably have out crossed to a different line somewhere within a generation or two.

If inbreeding is a concern, it is useful to determine the inbreeding coefficient of the stallion. The level of inbreeding that's considered acceptable varies with the breed and the breeder, but most breeders will draw a line in the neighborhood of 15-16%.

The inbreeding coefficient for thoroughbreds, on average, is somewhere around 85. Any individual, however, usually obtainable by studying the breed history, and have already been obtained by experts in many instances. In such cases you would want to know if the stallion you are considering is inbred to a higher or to a lower degree than the average of the breed. You certainly will want to know how the foal compares, and so will anyone considering buying the foal at a yearling sale or thereafter.

In evaluating siblings, sires, dams, grand sires and grand dams, the careful breeder will profit from at least a brief study of equine genetics. For instance, a given sire or dam will not necessarily pass the same genes to every offspring. Some sires, however, are known to be prepotent, meaning they seem to pass their good qualities along to their offspring no matter the mare's qualifications.

Because horse often possess some gens that are suppressed by the influence of others, full siblings can be entirely different from each other in certain traits and almost identical in others. This is due to one foal inheriting the dominant gene and the other inheriting the suppresses (recessive) gene. Unfortunately, there is no way for a breeder to know which alleles the horse will receive before breeding. Here the law of average holds. That law says that the chances of getting the combination of genes you want is much greater if the sire's offspring and the offspring of the sire's siblings and half-siblings have the characteristics you want.

EVALUATING PHYSICAL PROBLEMS

Another consideration is the number and kind of physical defects in the stallion (every stallion has at least one or two).

Some of these are the result of heredity; others, probably the majority, are the result of environment (what happened to the stallion during and after birth) For instance, a crooked leg could be the result of an accident, or he could have been born with it. Keep in mind that the stallion's conformation might have been responsible for the defect.

Unsoundness in the stallion is another matter entirely. If the stallion is unsound, you have a red flag warning you to consider carefully breeding to him. Blindness is one or both eyes, for instance, might or might not be inherited.

Evaluate the circumstances under which the horse became unsound. For example, conformation likely had nothing to do with a leg injury received from stepping in a gopher hole. However, severe arthritis after a career of mild work such as pleasure riding might have roots in poor joint

conformation that you don't want your foal to have. Even if the unsoundness itself is not transmissible, the tendency to acquire it after birth might be so. "Faulty conformation may predispose to unsoundness," says Frandson, "and that may cause rejection of the animal for the purpose it was intended."

An advisor might recommend disqualifying on general grounds any stallion which is unsound for any reason. Many advisors, however, would not go quite that far, choosing instead to evaluate the unsoundness relative to the horse's designated discipline. For example, lameness that only shows up after full-speed race work might be perfectly acceptable for a Western pleasure candidate.

Nevertheless, if the stallion under consideration is unsound, you should discuss the matter with a qualified equine veterinarian before signing a breeding contract.

NEED HELP?

The extension horse specialist for your state or your county agricultural agent (both of whom can be located by checking the local telephone directory under "Cooperative Extension Service") can be helpful in evaluating potential sires. The careful breeder also will check the reputation of agents and stud managers before seeking their advice or deciding on a sire.

The extension horse specialist works for the public and is paid with public funds, not private ones. The law requires that he/she be available to consult with every citizen who needs help in any field in which he/she is experienced. You need not be a full-time or even part-time farmer to ask for help.

In most cases, bloodstock agents or even top breeders with many stallions at their disposal can also help you work out sire selection issues. Genetics texts such as those listed below might also prove helpful in understanding breeding planning challenges.

Perhaps the most appropriate closing statement is one that has floating around for decades, if not centuries: You can look at a horse and know what he/she seems to be; you can study the pedigree and know what the horse ought to be; but only the offspring can tell you what horse really is!

Mare Seasonality

The mare is a seasonal breeder with a series of estrous cycle normally occurring the breeding season which coincides with long day lengths. The longest day of the year is June 22 and the shortest is December 22. Therefore mares should reach a peak in their reproductive activity around June 22 and be the least reproductively active in late December.

Anestrous period

The period in which the mare is the least reproductively active is termed the “anestrus” period and typically occurs during the winter months. Generally speaking, during this period, the mare will show no signs of estrus with the ovaries being very small and inactive. Some mares will show signs of estrus, but few will ovulate during this period.

Transitional period

As day length increases in the spring, the mare will begin to show signs of estrus beginning around March. However, regular ovulations do not begin until about 30 days after the first period of estrus. These early heats are often erratic and unpredictable lasting for two weeks or longer. During this period, the mare is changing from reproductive inactivity to maximal activity of the breeding season. This change is called the “transitional period”. Ovarian follicles may develop and grow, then regress (decrease in size) without ovulation. Therefore, attempts to breed mares during this transition period can be extremely frustrating and conception rates are low.

Breeding season

The natural breeding season typically begins around mid-April.

Fall transition period

Beginning in late summer and early fall, the mare again will go into a transitional time similar to that seen in the spring. The periods of estrus and ovulations become more erratic and irregular. As winter approaches, the estrous cycle is complete as the mare once again enters into anestrus.

Hair coat and reproductive seasonality

There is a positive correlation between the shedding of the hair in tufts and the first ovulation of the breeding season. The first ovulation of a mare generally occurs two months after she has begun to shed her winter hair in tufts. A smooth, “summer type” hair coat typically does not appear until after the first ovulation. Thus the shedding of hair can be used as an indicator that the ovulatory or breeding season is approaching. Furthermore, the horse appears to use photoperiod, or day length – not temperature, as the signal to change its hair coat from winter to summer and vice versa.

Management of transitional mares

All mares must pass through a transitional phase and anyone breeding mares through this phase realizes how frustrating this can be. Transitional mares typically will have long, erratic periods of estrus (heat) with low conception rates. One management practice that enhances normal estrus cycles is to place mares on exogenous progesterone for 10 to 15 days. Once removed from progesterone, most mares will return to estrus within 3 to 4 days and ovulate 9 to 10 days following progesterone withdrawal. For this practice to work, mares must have sufficient activity on their ovaries (several follicles of at least 20-25mm or larger). Most commonly, progesterone is given orally, marketed under the name – Regumate (altrenogest). Oral progesterone is given at a dosage of .044mg/kg body weight or approximately 1 ml per 110 pounds of body weight.

PEDIGREE CROSS INDEX

This Pedigree Cross Index allows a breeder to nick, inbreed or outcross his broodmares by easy reference. Indexed are the names of sires and dams included within the first three generations of all the stallions in the 2019 Stallion Directory.

Example: AFFIRMED - Charlie Barley, Mystery Storm, Peteski

In the above example, Affirmed appears in one of the first 3 generations of all the stallions listed after him.

Suppose a breeder has a mare that is a granddaughter of Mr. Prospector or has crosses of that sire in a mare's pedigree. He may want to breed her to a stallion with Northern Dancer blood to take advantage of the Northern Dancer--Mr. Prospector nick. By looking up "Northern Dancer" in this index, he can quickly see all the stallions in this register that have Northern Dancer appearing in one of the first three generations of their pedigrees.

If a breeder's mare is a granddaughter of Seattle Slew, he may wish to inbreed to that stallion and thereby get more of Seattle Slew's makeup in the foal. By checking "Seattle Slew" in the index, the breeder can readily find all the advertised stallions that have Seattle Slew in their pedigrees.

What if a breeder's mare is already inbred or linebred? She might have 2 or 3 crosses of Deputy Minister in her first four generations for example. The breeder may want to make sure the stallion he chooses for his mare has no Deputy Minister or no Deputy Minister up close in his pedigree. Stallion Owners;

Any stallion that stands the entire breeding season in Arizona, and files a copy of the The Jockey Club Report of Mares bred for that breeding season with the ATBA office, that stallion (s) offspring will be eligible to race in the Stallion Stakes Derby.

What this means to you as a stallion owner.

All 2021 foals of Arizona Stallions (standing the full 2019 breeding season in Arizona) will be eligible to enter the 2023 Stallion Stakes derby. This should create an exciting race as there are no early nominations, or late fees.

Stallion owners must send a copy of the Jockey Club Report of Mares Bred to the ATBA office each breeding season. This is mandatory if your stallions offspring is to have the opportunity to participate.

Foals need not be Arizona-bred, but must be by a stallion standing the full season in Arizona and a copy of the Report of Mares bred on file with the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders office.

The Arizona Stallion Stakes Derby is a restricted race for the offspring of Arizona Stallions.
