



ARIZONA STALLION OWNERS Keep your Stallions progeny eligible!

Stallion Owners;

Any stallion that stands the entire breeding season in Arizona, and files a copy of the The Jockey Club Report of Mares bred for that breeding season with the ATBA office, that stallion (s) offspring will be eligible to race in the Stallion Stakes Derby.

What this means to you as a stallion owner.

All 2024 foals of Arizona Stallions (standing the full 2022 breeding season in Arizona) will be eligible to enter the 2026 Stallion Stakes derby. This should create an exciting race as there are no early nominations, or late fees.

Stallion owners must send a copy of the Jockey Club Report of Mares Bred to the ATBA office each breeding season. This is mandatory if your stallions offspring is to have the opportunity to participate.

Foals need not be Arizona-bred, but must be by a stallion standing the full season in Arizona and a copy of the Report of Mares bred on file with the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders office.

The Arizona Stallion Stakes Derby is a restricted race for the offspringof Arizona Stallions.

THEY ARE WHAT THEY EAT:

BUILDING BLOCKS OF THOROUGHBRED NUTRITION

You are what you eat, and the same goes for your horse. These days the seemingly endless amount of options available, figuring out what is best for your horse can be daunting.

Depending on the age and activity level, a horse's nutritional needs can vary dramatically, and the consequences of taking the wrong nutritional approach with a horse can range from a subtle change in weight or attitude to a dramatic regression of heath or soundness.

"The first step in developing a feed plan for a horse is to understand exactly what that horse's role will be and what protocol they are under," explained Eric Hamelback, former General Manager of Adena Springs Farm who is now the CEO of the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association.

"For example, a lactating mare with a foal at her side will have extremely different nutritional requirements than a retired mare or a riding horse. Even yearlings being sales-prepped will have a much different daily routine, and thus different nutritional requirements, than a keeper yearling," he continued.

NUTRITIONAL COMPONENTS

The nutritional components that make up a horse's diet can be grouped into five categories: protein, carbohydrates, fats, vitamins and minerals. When calculating a horse's dietary needs, all sources of these nutrients must be considered, including pasture, hay, and concentrated feed.

Dr. Peter Morresey of Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital offers the following general overview of each:

Proteins: Requirements vary depending on the age and use of the horse. Young, growing horses require a higher protein percentage than mature horses. In addition to growth, increased protein requirements result from high workloads, pregnancy and lactation. Excess dietary protein is not used by the horse.

Carbohydrates: These provide the largest part of the horse's diet. Carbohydrates include both structural (fiber) and non-structural (starch, sugar) components. The horse's gut is designed to efficiently digest structural carbohydrates (roughage such as hay and grass) by virtue of the microorganisms in the large intestine. Sugars and starches, usually found in grains, are digested in the small intestine. As the horse evolved on a roughage-based diet, grains are only useful as a supplement to a roughage diet. Many older horses are unable to safely process high levels of sugars and starches in their diet.

Fats: added fat increases the energy density of the diet, allowing less overall feed to be given. Care must be taken with high fat diets to ensure other nutrient requirements are met, especially the requirement for adequate fiber.

Vitamins: these may be water-soluble (e.g. B vitamins) or fat-soluble (e.g. Vitamins A, D, E and K). The horse can synthesize many of the vitamins it needs from a balanced diet. Excessive vitamin supplementation is at best wasteful, and at worst harmful to the horse.

Minerals: Requirements change with the age and use of the horse. A balanced diet provides most of what the horse needs, and commercially available feeds are formulated to ensure minimum requirements are met. As with vitamins and protein, excessive supplementation may be of no benefit, and in some cases will be harmful.

Morresey explains that it is critical to feed based on the weight of the feed, not the volume, as the weight versus the volume of feed can vary greatly among different feeds and brands and from one flake or bale of hay to the next.

While each horse's body chemistry is different and the nuances of a feed and supplementation plan should be individualized, there are generalizations that can be made about a horse's nutritional requirements based on their age, activity level and/or usage.

FEEDING THE YOUNG HORSE

During a horse's formative years, they require higher amounts of protein, vitamins and minerals to develop strong bones and joints. They can get these nutrients through a mix of roughage, concentrate and supplements.

"When feeding young, growing horses, it is possible to over-supplement their diets with the addition of multiple supplements," explained Morresey. "Of special importance in the growing horse, the calcium to phosphorus ratio must be correct to ensure healthy skeletal development."

FEEDING THE EQUINE ATHLETE

The nutritional needs of horses in competition varies greatly based on their daily routine, as well as the amount of time they are in a stall versus turned out in a pasture.

"Racehorses spend more time in their stall, which means less of their diet comes from roughage," explained Hamelback. "Both racehorses and show horses need a good amount of protein and other nutrients, but whereas racehorses are in a stall for most of the day, they may be getting 70 percent of their diet from concentrated feed and 30 percent from roughage, they may not need as high of a protein content in their hay."

Riding horses and many show horses, on the other hand, can get the majority of their nutritional requirements from roughage due to their turnout schedule and workload and may only require 30 percent or less of their nutrients to come from concentrated feed.

FEEDING THE LACTATING MARE

Lactating mares require a higher amount of protein in their diets due to the production of milk for their foals.

"You want to feed a lactating mare a higher amount of crude protein," said Hamelback. "They might get a fifty-fifty ratio of roughage to concentrate. Even though they tend to be outside in pastures grazing most of the day, they need the extra nutrients so their weight doesn't drop as their bodies produce milk."

Feeding the Retired Horse or Horse in Light Work

Many horses with a low to medium intensity workload can maintain adequate weight, energy level and condition on nearly 100 percent roughage.

"The biggest thing, especially with horses in a large herd, is to look at each horse and his or her rank among their pasture mates. If they get chased off of their feed or aren't maintaining weight as well as the others, for example, it may be necessary to separate them from the group at feed times."

COMMON ISSUES AIDED BY DIETARY CHANGES AND SUPPLEMENTATION

Thoughtful changes made to a horse's diet or supplementation plan can positively affect a horse's health, condition and energy levels.

"An endless list of supplements are available to add to a horse's diet," said Dane Tatarniuk, DVM of the University of Minnesota College of Veterinary Medicine. "Vitamin E can be used to aid a horse with muscle weakness or atrophy and probiotics, such as Saccharomyces boulardii can be used as an aide for digestion and to reduce the risk of colic or diarrhea."

Weight-gain is another common issue that many horse owners will face at one time or another, and it is often a delicate balance to increase a horse's weight without also increasing their energy level.

"Unlimited access to grass hay is a good start to increase a horse's weight, and providing other avenues of energy not derived from sugar-rich grain concentrates is key in not making the horse overly high-strung," explained Tatarniuk. "Some alternatives include beet pulp, rice bran, or commercially manufactured pelleted feeds that are high in fat, as compared to carbohydrates, and are specifically formulated to assist in weight gain.

Morresey, Tatarniuk and Hamelback all reinforced that the best approach to creating a balanced feed program to meet a horse's needs is to consult with a veterinarian and a nutritionist. Many feed companies have nutritionists or nutritional consultants on staff to assist customers in finding the best feed for their horse's needs, and the best way to incorporate it into their diet.

"It's often overlooked, but it is so important to get forage and soil samples of the land you're keeping your horses on," said Hamelback. "The basis of building your feed program is knowing and working around what you can't control."


The ATBA Julep Cup is presented each year to an individual that made an impact on out industry in Arizona. This years recipient is Kevin Eikleberry.

HORSE RACING TAX RULES UPDATED BY US TREASURY & IRS HORSE RACING WINS AS US TREASURY & IRS ISSUE UPDATED TAX RULES

The U.S. Treasury Department and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) today announced that they will formally adopt modernized regulations regarding the withholding and reporting of pari-mutuel proceeds. The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) has long pressed for these updated regulations that will allow horseplayers to keep more of their winnings, thereby increasing the amount wagered on U.S. pari-mutuel racing by as much as 10 percent annually, or upwards of \$1 billion, according to independent estimates.

The new rules were posted late Monday afternoon as a Public Inspection Document. They are scheduled to be officially published in Wednesday's edition of the Federal Register and will go into full effect by no later than Nov. 14, giving racing associations, totalisator companies, and advance deposit wagering (ADW) operators up to 45 days to implement these important changes; however, some may elect to start as soon as Thursday.

These landmark U.S. Treasury regulations will have an enormously positive impact on horseplayers, the racing industry, and the federal government," said NTRA President & CEO Alex Waldrop. "I am extremely proud of the NTRA's legislative team for spearheading this effort, which will prove to be among the most meaningful regulatory advances made by our industry in decades. The results of this much-needed measure will be horseplayers keeping more of their winnings, racetracks generating more pari-mutuel handle, and government collecting additional tax revenue. This is a sure bet where everyone wins!"

Added Waldrop: "This day would never have come without the persistence of Thoroughbred racing's friends in Congress, especially Rep. John Yarmuth of Kentucky, Rep. Pat Meehan of Pennsylvania, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell and our many bipartisan supporters on Capitol Hill. We also are indebted to the industry stakeholders and thousands of customers of Thoroughbred racing who signed our petition or submitted public comments in favor of these changes."

Under the new regulations, the IRS will consider the inclusion of a bettor's entire investment in a single pari-mutuel pool when determining the amount reported or withheld for tax purposes, as opposed to only the amount wagered on the correct result.

For example, the amount wagered by a Pick Six player who hits with one of 140 combinations on a \$1-minimum wager now will be \$140, which is the total amount bet into the Pick Six pool. This more accurate calculation will remove the significant reporting and withholding obligations on horseplayers and the unnecessary paperwork for the IRS that was a result of the prior rule that used only the \$1 bet on the single winning combination as the amount wagered.

Another way to look at it - A winning \$2 Pick 6 ticket that paid more than \$5,000 would have had taxes withheld, even if the total investment was \$100. Now, a \$100 Pick 6 wager will only have taxes withheld if the winning payout is over \$30,000.

"This is a major victory for all pari-mutuel wagering customers," said Judy Wagner, the Horseplayers' Representative on the NTRA Board of Directors and winner of the 2001 National Horseplayers Championship (NHC). "It would not have occurred without the leadership of the NTRA and the support of thousands of horseplayers who actively participated in the process to modernize these regulations."

The amended regulations, advocated by the NTRA and its legislative team, define the "amount of the wager" to include the entire amount wagered into a specific pari-mutuel pool by an individual - not just the winning base unit as is the case today - so long as all wagers made into a specific pool by an individual are made on a single totalisator ticket if the wager is placed onsite. The modernized regulations will have the same positive results for ADW customers and will not impact how those wagers are currently made.

The NTRA has pushed for the modernization of pari-mutuel withholding and reporting rules for several years. As more and more parimutuel wagering was directed toward exotic wagering pools it become clear that the tax rules were becoming an increasing and unfair burden on horseplayers as those outdated rules significantly increased the incidence of winning tickets subject to withholding and reporting. These new rules are the product of all the work the NTRA, and other industry stakeholders, undertook with Congressional representatives and Treasury and IRS officials.

"This represents a great triumph by the entire NTRA legislative team, including the bipartisan Horse PAC, which played an instrumental role in the passage of these regulations that will benefit all segments of the industry," said Horse PAC chairman William S. (Bill) Farish. "We thank the hundreds of individual stakeholders who contribute to Horse PAC; they played a major role in today's victory."

Waldrop noted that the NTRA has been working behind the scenes since January with industry groups - including totalisator companies, ADWs, and racing organizations - to ensure a smooth implementation for customers.

"For the industry to fully realize the benefits of modernized regulations for pari-mutuel withholding and reporting it is essential that we deliver a seamless transition to our customers," he said. "We are optimistic that the industry will be fully prepared to institute these landmark changes by no later than November 14."

EQUINE VACCINES BREAKING DOWN THE BASICS UCDAVIS VETERINARY MEDICINE

WHAT IS A STANDARD VACCINATION PROGRAM FOR HORSES?

It would be convenient to have a one-size-fits-all, black and white schedule for equine vaccinations. However, as we all know, horses are individuals (and rarely concerned with what's convenient), which results in a lot of gray areas. As such, there is no standard equine vaccination program. The need for specific vaccines depends on many factors, including risk of disease, horse age, location, and if they travel. It is important to weigh the consequences and costs of each specific disease against the costs of vaccination and potential vaccine reactions.

The American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) provides guidelines for a set of core vaccines, which are "vaccinations that protect from diseases endemic to a region, those with potential public health significance, required by law, virulent/highly infectious, and/or those posing a risk of severe disease. Core vaccines have clearly demonstrated efficacy and safety, and thus exhibit a high enough level of patient benefit and low enough level of risk to justify their use in the majority of patients." Equine vaccines that meet these criteria are for Eastern/Western equine encephalomyelitis (EEE, WEE), rabies, tetanus, and West Nile virus (WNV).

Other available equine vaccines are "risk-based vaccines". These include equine herpesvirus (rhinopneumonitis, or "rhino", specifically EHV-1 or EHV-4), equine influenza, strangles, and others.

Organizations, venues and boarding facilities may require some of these vaccines prior to entry or competition.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO MONITOR MY HORSE AFTER A VACCINATION?

Horse owners, barn managers, and other caretakers should be aware of possible vaccine reactions. While mild, often localized, reactions are not uncommon, severe, systemic reactions are fortunately extremely rare. Monitor your horse(s) for at least 72 hours after any vaccination so you and your veterinarian can respond promptly to any complications.

Potential adverse reactions depend on a number of factors, including the route of vaccine administration (intramuscular (IM) or intranasal (IN).

EQUINE VACCINES BREAKING DOWN THE BASICS CONTINUED

Local reactions, such as muscle soreness and swelling, or the formation of an abscess around the injection site, can occur. Some horses may exhibit a mild fever, which can contribute to inappetance and lethargy. In other words, your horse may not feel like themselves the day after a vaccination and it is often advisable to avoid any strenous exercise, including riding (hand walking is usually okay).

Systemic reactions occur throughout the body and are not restricted to the administration site. These can include hives, colic, swelling of the limbs and abdomen (purpura hemorrhagica), difficulty breathing, and anaphylaxis.

Although mild reactions often resolve on their own, all adverse reactions should be reported to your veterinarian who will share pertinent information with the vaccine manufacturer and/ or the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Center for Veterinary Biologics. Since adverse reactions may be unpredictable, it is recommended to avoid vaccinations within two to three weeks of a competition, sale, or travel to ensure time for treatment, should the need arise.

DOES MY HORSE HAVE TO BE VACCINATED EVERY YEAR? WHAT HAPPENS IF MY HORSE MISSES A YEAR OF VACCINATIONS?

As with many questions about equine vaccines, the need for a horse to be vaccinated every year should be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. The answer depends on the risk that the horse will come in contact with that particular pathogen. Is the disease common to that specific location? Is it a vector-borne (i.e. transmitted by another animal or insect) disease that depends on seasonal activity of mosquitoes or other insects? Does the horse travel for competitions? Does the horse live near other horses that travel frequently? How contagious is the pathogen? Some vaccines are more effective than others, which also factors into the overall equation.

The implications of a horse missing a year of vaccinations depends on the immunization history of that animal. The lapse can have more significant consequences if it is during the primary course of vaccinations for young or naïve horses that have not yet mounted optimal immune responses, whereas it may be less significant in adults that have otherwise been routinely vaccinated.

- * FUTURITY (Two races Fillies & Colts/Gelding Divisions) to be run in the Fall of 2027 at six furlongs.
- * DERBY- (One race Fillies/Colts/Geldings) Derby to be run in the Spring of 2027 at one mile and one sixteenth.
- * OAKS -(One race Fillies) Oaks to be run in the Spring of 2028at six and one half furlongs.

* FUTURITY - TWO RACES - FILLIES & COLTS DIVISIONS

Futurity for two-year-olds. Starters shall not exceed twelve. All horses must ENTER trials (whether a trial is needed or not) or race in the trials to be eligible to run in the Futurity. The twelve qualifiers and one preferred horse from each trial will be placed on an also eligible list, in order of preference by the racing secretary the following morning. Should either division (fillies or colts) fail to fill (five or less), the two divisions may be combined into one race. All entrants to trials or race must pay \$500 to enter. All entrants must pass the entry box for the trials and finals at the usual time of closing for that racing day. Weights for the Futurity trials and finals: Fillies, 120 lbs.; Colts/Gelding 122 lbs.

* THE GENE FLEMING BREEDERS' DERBY - One Race - Colts/Geldings • NO TRIALS

Derby for three-year-olds. Starters shall not exceed twelve. To start in the Derby all entrants must pay \$300 to pass the entry box by the usual time of closing for the Derby. In the event there are more than twelve at the time of entry, the starters shall be determined at that time with preference given to those entries that have accumulated the highest earnings, with winners preferred regardless of earnings. Entries not drawn into the body of the race will be placed on an also-eligible list in order of preference. In the event of a scratch in the body of the race prior to the official scratch time, entries on the also-eligible list will be moved into the body of the race based upon their order of preference. In the event that two horses have the same amount of earning position on the also-eligible they will be determined by lot. Any nominee excluded from running as a result of the aforementioned preference rule shall have the entry fee refunded. Weights: Fillies 120 lbs. Colts/Gelding 124 lbs.

* JOANNE DYE BREEDERS' OAKS - One Race - Fillies • NO TRIALS

Oaks for three-year-olds fillies. Starters shall not exceed twelve. To start in the Oaks all entrants must pay \$300 to pass the entry box by the usual time of closing for the Oaks. In the event there are more than twelve at the time of entry, the starters shall be determined at that time with preference given to those entries that have accumulated the highest earnings, with winners preferred regardless of earnings. Entries not drawn into the body of the race will be placed on an also-eligible list in order of preference. In the event of a scratch in the body of the race prior to the official scratch time, entries on the also-eligible list will be moved into the body of the race based upon their order of preference. In the event that two horses have the same amount of earning position on the also-eligible they will be determined by lot. Any nominee excluded from running as a result of the aforementioned preference rule shall have the entry fee refunded. Weights: Fillies 122 lbs.

ALL RACES WILL BE RUN UNDER THE FOLLOWING RULES.

All races will be restricted to 2023 Arizona-bred foals, registered and certified by the Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders Association. To be eligible to start in the Futurities or the Derby/Oaks foals must be registered and certified by February 1, 2025. The ATBA will deduct ten percent of all nominating and sustaining payments for clerical fees before each race. The balance to be divided as follows: Original and sustaining payments to be split 50% to the Futurities and 50% to the Derby/Oaks. (Futurities and Derby/Oaks monies to be split % by gender). Monies will be divided: 50% to winner, 20% to second, 10% to third; 5% to fourth; 3% to fifth; 2% to sixth; (in the futurity 1% to the next six finishers) (in the derby/oaks 1% to each of the next six finishers) and 4% to be paid to the nominator of the winner of each race. To remain eligible for the Derby/Oaks, horses do not have to start in the Futurities, however all sustaining payments must be made through October 15, 2027. To remain eligible for the Derby/Oaks an additional \$300.00 is due January 15, 2028.
